

"FLYING SAUCER" SCARE

SWEEPS SINGAPORE

SINGAPORE, Sept. 4 (A.A.P.-Reuter's).—A "flying saucer" scare swept Singapore to-night. Several people reported to R.A.F. authorities at the civil airport at Kallang that they had seen a fast moving light which "could only have been a 'flying saucer.'" An R.A.F. spokesman said: "This is no leg pull."

"Something strange has been seen by at least six persons and probably many more. We have no explanation to offer yet," he said.

Mrs. R. Whitley told Reuter's that she saw a large white light much bigger than any star moving at a terrific speed and quite low over the Kallang airport.

"It circled at a high speed and disappeared across the sea in the direction of Northern Sumatra," he said.

An R.A.F. spokesman said: "It could not have been a star that people saw because there was thick cloud over Singapore at the time—10.35 p.m. local time."
