

“Saucer” Scare In Singapore

SINGAPORE, Sept. 5.
A.A.P.-Reuter.—“This is no
leg pull,” a R.A.F. spokes-
man said last night after
several people had reported
having seen a “fast-moving
light that could only have
been a flying saucer.”

The spokesman said “some-
thing strange has been seen by
at least six people, and prob-
ably many more.

“We have no explanation to
offer yet.”

“Strange Light”

Mrs. Rosemary Whitley,
wife of a Government radio
engineer, who was on duty at
Kallang airport, said: “A
Malay policeman came run-
ning in, shouting that there
was a strange light in the sky.
I went out and saw a large
white light, much bigger than
any star, moving at terrific
speed and quite low over the
airport.

“The policeman said it had
come from the south-east,
which is in the direction of
Sumatra.

“The flying saucer circled
at high speed and disappeared
across the sea in the direction
of northern Sumatra.”

“No Star”

An R.A.F. spokesman said:
“It could not possibly have
been a star that people saw,
because there was thick cloud
over Singapore at the time—
10.35 p.m.”
