

Saucer men picked flowers

LISBON — The story of aluminium - suited men who climbed out of a "flying saucer" to pick flowers and shrubs, was told in a letter published in the Portuguese newspaper "Diario De Lisboa."

The writer, Cesar Cardoso, said he saw the flying saucer on a mountain near the village of Almaseda, in the Serra da Guardnha.

He said three men six feet seven inches tall, clothed in aluminium suits, got out, cut some flowers, shrubbery and twigs, and put them in a shining box.

Cardoso said that he and three friends were invited to enter the saucer. When they refused, the men did not insist, but climbed into their saucer and flew off vertically at a terrific speed, emitting a shower of sparks.
