"FLYING SAUCER CIRCUS"

A "flying saucer circus" has visited the skies around Lyons, France, according to four separate reports from eyewitnesses.

A farmer, Yves David, insisted that he was actually touched by a creature in a space-suit, who paralysed him momentarily with a green ray and then made off in a trail of sparks.

Dr. M. Martinet, a former artillery observer backed by 15 witnesses, said he saw a dark grey mass hovering over mountains at about 6000 feet.
