

"FLYING SAUCER" NEGATIVES ARE WANTED

Sydney: Civil aviation authorities in Sydney have received pictures of what was described as a "flying saucer", claimed to have been seen over Wilcannia last week. They want the negatives now.

The pictures, a group of three, have been microscopically examined by aviation men and photographic experts, but they are not yet regarded as entirely genuine.

The Civil Aviation Department has wired to Wilcannia for the negatives. The pictures, taken by a Wilcannia station worker (K. Weston) were sent to the department at the weekend, following a story that an "object" had been seen at Mena Murtee sta-

seen at Menzies station, moving slowly across the sky, about 500 feet up, and making a "terrific" noise.

They were sent with a letter signed by G. J. Porter, of Wilcannia, mentioning that they

were not for publication if they were proved genuine.

The Civil Aviation Regional Director (Mr. Hepburn) said today "the pictures, which to 99 per cent of the population would seem genuine, show an object like an inverted saucer with an inverted teacup on top. In the foreground is a landscape of trees and paddocks".
