

# 'Saucer' pictures — NSW story

**SYDNEY, Today. — Civil aviation authorities in Sydney have received pictures of a "flying saucer," claimed to have been seen over Wilcannia, in south-western NSW, last week.**

The pictures — a group of three—have been microscopically examined by aviation and photographic experts

The Civil Aviation Department has wired to Wilcannia for the negatives.

## "500 ft. up"

The pictures, said to be taken by Wilcannia station worker K Weston, were sent to the Department following a story that an "object" had been seen at Mena Murtee station moving slowly across the sky—about 500 ft. up and making a "terrific" noise.

They were sent with a letter signed "G J. Porter," with the address, Reid St. Wilcannia, mentioning they were not for publication if proved genuine.

The Civil Aviation Regional Director, Mr A. Hepburn, said today: -

"In the foreground is a landscape of trees and paddocks."
