

Saucer Confirmed By Radar

CANBERRA, December 16.—"Flying Saucers," reported by a Nowra Fleet Air Arm pilot, are being investigated by Naval headquarters in Melbourne.

The pilot, Lieutenant O'Farrell, saw two objects which he took to be flying saucers when flying at night over Goulburn, New South Wales, on a return trip to Nowra.

He told authorities at the Nowra naval air station and base for the fleet air arm, he saw what appeared to be the lights of two aircraft when flying about 285 miles an hour.

He said the saucers flew on each side of him, circled his plane, then drew rapidly away.

At his request, a Nowra radar crew fixed his position and reported back. The screen showed the echo of another object moving alongside his Sea Fury.

This is the first known case in which an unidentified object in the sky has been confirmed by radar.

Authorities ascertained there were no other military aircraft in the vicinity at the time.
