

“Flying saucer” was meteor

MELBOURNE. — A “flying saucer” seen over Melbourne early on Sunday was dismissed as a meteor yesterday by Mr. Arthur Clarke, former chairman of the British Inter-Planetary Society.

Mr. Clarke said there was nothing mysterious about the object. Any bright moving object seen in the sky at night was almost certainly a meteor.

Mr. Clarke said meteors flashed from space into the earth's atmosphere at speeds of up to 100,000 miles an hour. The friction caused a brilliant burst of light.
