The silly season has once again hit America and with it comes the invasion of little green men from "flying saucers".

These reports have been accompanied by plenty of ridicule from "sane-minded" observers but there are people in Perth who do not laugh at the reports of the "little green men."

For they have seen—and reported—fantastic space objects which have yet to be explained by official sources as something commonplace.

No one—as far as is known—has yet to verify reports in Australia compared with those received in America that small men with hands like claws have emerged from flying saucers to terrify the immediate neighbourhood.

But responsible citizens in this State, whose credulity is above suspicion, have from time to time reported seeing objects in the sky around the Perth area which have yet to be explained, even by those who greet these reports with derisive laughter.

A resident of Victoria Park was exercising two horses near the pine forest adjoining Clontarf Orphanage when he noticed a lighted object in the sky approaching him at great

speed.

He was riding one horse and leading another and thinking it was an aircraft in trouble, pulled into the bush at the side of the road.

The object continued its downward flight and came dangerously close to the man and horses before it suddenly veered upward and sped off at an angle of 45 degrees before passing out of sight.

Here is the horseman's description this week of

description this week of the weird incident:

"It came at me like a falling aircraft and I was frightened that it would crash into the horses so I pulled over into the bush.

"As it came closer I could see an object that appeared to be in the shape of two saucers placed together. Amber lights were showing inside the object and it was continually revolving, making a whirring noise like a

shell going over on the battlefield.

"It hovered for a moment over me and then turned upwards and flew away at an incredible speed.

"I told my wife about it when I got home but went no further as I knew I would not be believed but I will swear that the object was like nothing I have seen before or since."

Backing this man's story comes the experience of another Perth man who was holidaying at Northampton.

He saw a cylindrical-

He saw a cylindrical-shaped object approach the town at almost unbelievable speed—hover stationary over the town for a few seconds—and then veer away at right-angles to be lost to sight.

Are you still sceptical?

It was not so long ago that residents of the Canning Bridge area saw an object in the sky that allied itself to the earlier reports in every way.

The object was also reported by residents of Scarborough.

The Mirror reporter quizzed various Perth people about these reports and was given varying opinions but most people were sceptical.

"Too much grog" was the average comment but other citizens said "It may not be right but it has never been explained."

Residents of East Katanning once reported a mysterious object in the

sky which was said to have been followed by a long vapor trail.

R.A.A.F. spokesman said that a Vampire aircraft was flying in the vicinity that night but Katanning people have yet to be convinced.

These reports are, naturally, not as colorful as those received from America where one man said that he had his hair singed by a flying saucer.

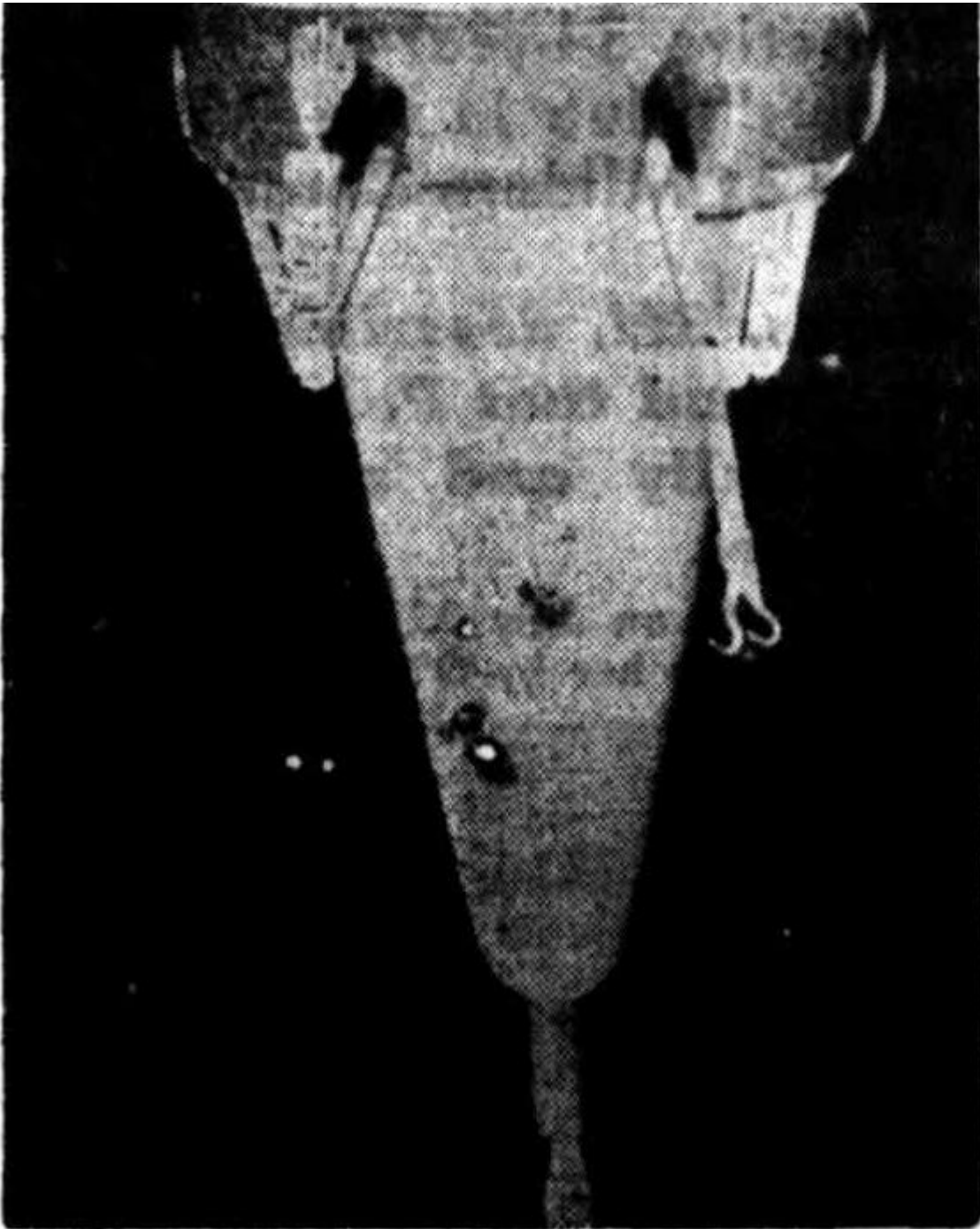
But W.A. reports of sky phenomenon have been made by responsible citizens who are not usually affected by "imaginitis."
