

ALREADY WE'VE A SATELLITE

LONDON, Sunday: A report that a satellite has for several months been circling the earth, 400 miles above the equator, is to be published in America and Britain, the "Sunday Despatch" said today.

It was first detected by United States Air Force radar stations and has been seen through a huge telescope at Palomar Observatory, California, the paper said.

The satellite is said to be large, possibly between 10 and 20 tons, and dull blue, which makes it difficult to see against the sky.

Major Donald E. Keyhoe, who was at one time with the United States Air Force intelligence, and who still claims to have access to offi-

cial documents, has prepared the report.

that the satellite may be an experimental rocket fired from America which escaped from the earth's gravity.

It is believed an American rocket was lost while being tracked by radar nearly 200 miles up.
