

Admits To Flying Saucer Hoax

LONDON, Tuesday (A.A.P.-Reuter). — Inventor Frank Russell, 40, has admitted that he hoaxed the Midlands with a home-made flying saucer, according to The London Daily Sketch.

The newspaper said that Russell built his "saucer" in a workroom in his council house in Bigglesworth, Bedfordshire. He flew it at night and its flights were always followed by reports of "mysterious objects" seen in the sky.

However, yesterday, The Daily Sketch, said, Russell revealed the basis of his "saucer" was a four-foot wide wire framework which he had covered with aluminium paper. He had made portholes and fitted electric bulbs powered by batteries inside to make the "saucer" glow.
