

Development Of 'Flying Saucer' Stops

WASHINGTON, Wednesday (A.A.P.)
—Development of a “flying saucer” de-
signed to give the U.S. Army airborne
cavalry will be abandoned, according
to United Press International.

Within a few days the last of more than £3,348,000 set aside for the radical new aircraft would be used by a Canadian firm selected to produce the “saucer,” the newsagency said.

However, the Defence Department had confirmed that farther work on the joint U.S. Air Force-Army project would be suspended, U.P.I. said.

Reasons for the decision

were not revealed.

U.P.I. said the Canadian company wanted to continue the project but the Army decided against it after it had invested about £1,758,714.

Now the Air Force had decided not to spend any more of its money, the newsagency added.
