

# Hundreds see sky lights

SYDNEY, Friday. — Unidentified flying objects were sighted over N.S.W., Queensland, and the A.C.T. early tonight.

Police, newspaper, radio, television and weather bureau switchboards were jammed by caller reporting them.

They remained visible for about 10 seconds.

Opinions were varied, but the likely explanation was an unofficial comment from the R.A.A.F., which described the phenomenon as

"probably a satellite disintegrating as it re-entered the earth's atmosphere."

Two Goulburn people reported seeing them.

Peter Kerr, of Lithgow Street, said he saw six or seven objects "something like satellites with a red tail behind them."

Another Goulburn man, who refused to give his name, claimed he saw the objects flying "in formation."

A sighting of the objects was reported to The Canberra Times by a Campbell

was reported to The Canberra Times by a Campbell woman.

The woman, of Anzac Park, said she saw them at 7.40 p.m., travelling south-east over Mt. Ainslie toward Canberra airport.

"They flew across the sky just like aeroplanes," she said, "but they were too fast to be aircraft."

A Brisbane message says a Quilpie (far south-west Queensland) resident also reported strange unidentified objects.
