

# U.F.O. Investigator to Visit

**A member of the Society for the Investigation of U.F.O. (unidentified flying objects) is to visit King Island in the near future.**

The visit follows several reports that strange and unusual lights in the night sky have been seen from King Island.

The reports given state that on several separate occasions a light which resembles a star but differs in colour has been observed.

The features of the light that have attracted attention include the fact that it moves, changes in colour, and at times disappears, only to reappear in a different location.

Although most reports have been sketchy, at least two people have been known to have observed the light through high powered binoculars, and have reported that the object is cigar-shaped and appears to be developing a vapour trail.

ation announcer, Mr. Kevin Arnett, is to carry out the Investigation for the Society for the Investigation of U.F.O. on King Island.

Mr. Arnett stated last week that the aim of his Society was to investigate all reports given to them.

All investigations were carried out with an open mind, as to date evidence produced had not established beyond reasonable doubt that such objects as flying saucers did exist.

By carrying out investigations of all sightings, it was eventually hoped to prove the U.F.O. did exist, or alternatively, that the sightings could be attributed to natural causes.

In addition to people who have already contacted the Society in Melbourne, Mr. Arnett is anxious to talk to any other King Island resident who may have noticed strange occurrences in the sky.
