

Check on our UFOs

The world's leading authority on UFOs (unidentified flying objects) arrived in Papua New Guinea yesterday to investigate recent reports of sightings here.

Dr J. Allen Hynek, Professor of Astronomy at the North Western University, Evanston, Illinois, USA, will visit the Milne Bay District to talk to people who

talk to people who say they have seen UFOs.

And he is trying to find out more about recent reports of "a second sun" from the Markham Valley with the help of Post-Courier columnist Jack McCarthy.

Dr Hynek heard of the sightings through Canon N. Cruttwell, of Agaun, via Alotau, an experienced international reporter and investigator of the phenomena.

Dr Hynek came to Sydney from the U.S. to attend an international astronomical congress ("the subject of UFOs didn't come up").

"My overall purpose in coming to Papua New Guinea is to see whether there is any difference in the UFOs reported in this part of the world and those elsewhere," he said.

“So far, I have not found any difference between one place and another — and we have them from more than 100 different countries.

“I don't expect to find any difference here — but if there were a difference, it would have to be investigated.”

Dr Hynek said five out of six “sightings” were illusions.
