

Sighting of two UFOs is reported

PERTH, Sunday. — Three Commonwealth departments are investigating reported sightings of two unidentified flying objects over central Australia early yesterday.

Two sightings of objects were made at Alice Springs and were linked to an earlier report from a Department of Civil Aviation base at Derby, WA.

Today the DCA and the Departments of Air and Defence began investigating the sightings.

A DCA spokesman in Melbourne said the first report of an unidentified object crossing the WA coast had come from Derby when an observer said he heard what sounded like a high-speed, high-flying aircraft passing overhead.

The Alice Springs air-

The Alice Springs airport was put on semi-alert after the report was passed on through the DCA in Darwin.

Observers at Alice Springs saw a light in the sky at 5.45am which appeared to be heading for Sydney.

Thirty minutes later the same observers saw a similar moving light which appeared to be heading for Adelaide.

The manager of the Alice Springs airport, Mr A. Miers, said today that no noise had been heard from either object. No radio contact had been made with the objects.
