

U.F.O.

It was approximately 5.45 a.m., Friday before last. Five fishermen were out to sea, off Noosa, enjoying the dawn when they spotted a mysterious object in the eastern sky, directly over the rising sun.

The object, which none of the men could identify, stayed visible for about 15 minutes, until after the sun had risen.

The men, Phillip Massoud, Wally Hayter, Kyle Smith, Sid Johns and C. Pitts, a sergeant of Police from Brisbane, measured the object as it moved parallel to the horizon, and by the compass measurement it moved 60 degrees before disappearing. They described the U.F.O. as having a distinct blowing exhaust.
