Timba couple saw UFO — and photographed it

Four Toowoomba people claim they sighted an unidentified flying object last Sunday evening and photographed it.

The U.F.O. was first sighted by Mr. and Mrs. N. R. Kettle, of 794 Ruthven Street and later observed by Mrs. Kettle's parents, Mr. and Mrs. R. J. Brooks, of Stenner Street.

Mrs. Kettle said yesterday they took several pictures of the U.F.O. with two colour cameras and are anxiously awaiting the result on the colour slides.

Describing the sighting to a Chronicle reporter yesterday, Mrs. Kettle said she and her husband were driving home at about 8.10 on Sunday night north along Ruthven Street, from Stenner Street, when they saw a bright, yellow light in the western sky over the Harristown area.

It appeared to be travelling at the same speed as their vehicle. At the intersection of Alderley and Ruthven streets it appeared to stop for several minutes in the sky and rose in height. Up to this time it was trav-

elling north, but then it reversed direction and travelled quickly towards the western horizon.

Mrs. Kettle said they picked up their cameras and drove to the rear of 7SD at Harristown, picking up her parents on the way.

When they photographed it it was heading for the Westbrook area. She said it was shaped something like an elipsoid (like a slightly flattened ball, but not as flat as two saucers placed together.)

Mrs. Kettle said all four of them were firmly of the opinion that it was not an aircraft.

She said neither she nor her husband was a "Flying saucer crank," but they had never seen any phenomenon like this before.

After losing sight of it on the western horizon they drove to Mt. Kynoch and stayed there until 10.30, but did not see it again. She said she and her husband would like to hear from others who sighted the U.F.O.
