

U.F.O. info sought

Our Society is interested to learn that a King Island man recently reported sighting an unidentified flying object. This baffling phenomenon, which, for nearly 30 years has defied a convincing explanation, is now coming under close scrutiny in scientific circles, particularly in America and France.

The scientific world, after years of scepticism, is now beginning to realise that the best sightings provide evidence of a genuinely unknown phenomenon, and a world-wide data-collection network has been established in America by Dr. J. Allen Hynek, a professional astronomer, who for many years was the leading civilian consultant to the U.S. Air Force in its "Project Blue Book" investigations.

Many witnesses to these phenomena are understandably reluctant to make their experiences known for fear of becoming a target for ridicule. However, we can assure anyone supplying us with information that no unwanted publicity will result, and that their evidence will be taken seriously.
