

Light yarn quite absorbing

ROSARIO, Argentina, Thurs, AAP—

A 29-year-old Argentinian carpenter said yesterday he travelled abroad a space vehicle last month, 12 days after being visited by four humanoids dressed in yellow and carrying spacesuits.

Juan Gomez, a resident of this city 330km north of Buenos Aires, said that after a blinding flash of light illuminated his bedroom on June 16, the four creatures, all less than 50cm tall, appeared and spoke intelligibly.

Mr Gomez said that 12 days later, an in-

tense light "absorbed" him while he strolled in the outskirts of the city, and the next thing he remembers is awakening 15 hours afterward far from Rosario.
