

More UFOs reported

The South Coast could lay claim to the title of the UFO capital of South Australia following further reports of mysterious lights in our skies on Wednesday night.

The reports come hot on the heels of a report in The Times of September 1 in which two local families claimed to have seen a UFO.

Up to 10 people have confirmed the most recent sightings — and 68-year-old John Rose, of Victor Harbor, has video footage of lights he says are “unexplainable”.

Mr Rose said he, and his son Geoff, saw four strange lights at

about 8.30pm, but only captured two on his home video equipment.

“I saw one early, then two together, then one more,” he said.

“I thought the first one was a plane or helicopter but it had an orange light and aircraft don't have orange lights.

“It looked as if they followed Waterport Road — there were no flashing lights and no noise.”

Mr Rose, who has a pilot's licence, was adamant that the lights were not those of a normal aircraft because they did not have the characteristics of such lights.

He said the lights

about 8.30pm, but

followed identical flight paths, coming from the north-east (Goolwa), following the line of the hills at the back of Port Elliot and then disappearing to the north.

“There was no hovering or stopping and then speeding off like UFOs are said to do,” Mr Rose said.

“The lights travelled somewhere between 100 and 150 knots at a height of about 1500 feet.

“The two lights travelled in perfect formation and then one went above the other.

“Geoff said he could see a reasonably large black object, with no wings, through the

binoculars.”

Reports of later sighting, at 11.10pm, have come flooding in.

have come flooding in, with witnesses describing similar colored lights but in greater numbers.

Prue Graham told The Times that her daughter Holly had seen up to five orange/red lights and, after she told the family about the lights, Mrs Graham's husband Ken saw one hit the water between Granite Island and Victor Harbor — on the Port Elliot side of the causeway.

He said it sat on the water for about five seconds before the lights disappeared.

“It looked like a dome with four or five lights going around it.

“It was about 15 feet across.

Maureen Weber, who lives in the Hayborough area also saw a number of lights at the same time and

at the same time and says she saw one floating on the water between the island and the shore.

"I've had the flu and I'm on medication so, at first, I thought I was seeing things," she said.

"I rang my friend John Alexander to ask if he could see them and he confirmed what I saw.

"I thought they might have been flares."

"They weren't huge. It was like these globes moving across the sky — I just couldn't believe it.
