

Guyra UFO set to remain a mystery

Guyra's UFO mystery is set to remain just that - a mystery.

That is unless another backer is prepared to fork out the funds to take another look for what is believed to be a meteorite, buried deep in the bottom of Guyra Dam.

The development follows the failure of Canberra-based Venturi Education to find the object after a mystery backer poured several thousand dollars into the project.

While disappointed with the failure, Guyra Shire Council general manager Geoff Brooks said he had not given up hope of uncovering the meteorite, which struck the dam last December.

"Steve Kelly of Venturi Education spent three days on-site and explored the hole down to a depth of a couple of metres, and apart from some gravel they could not find an object," he said.

"Obviously that is an immense disap-

pointment to everybody and all sorts of theories abound at the moment.

"Frankly, I was surprised there wasn't something down there but it had got to the point where the backer had spent a reasonable

amount of money and didn't want to go any further."

Mr Brooks said council was willing to give in-kind support to anyone else keen on searching for the mystery object.

"There must have

been something there - I mean something happened," he said.

"Did it hit the bedrock and deflect somewhere else? Did it deflect on the way down the hole?"

"It's something none of us can explain, but if

anybody else would like to come and have a look, we would be happy to go through the approval process once again.

"But if they don't it will remain a mystery like the Guyra Ghost."
