# Mysterious night flight over city

SOME excitement was caused at Cardiff on Tuesday night by the passage over the city of what was believed to be an aircraft, whether dirigible or aeroplane could not be discovered.

It carried a brilliant light, and travelled at sixty to seventy miles an hour at a considerable height.

Crowds in the streets watched the flight, and the chief-constable of Glamorgan (Captain Lionel Lindsay) who was one of the spectators

telephoned to Penarth police station to record the flight.

The route taken was from north-west to south-east, the light disappearing over the Bristol Channel towards Weston-super-Mare.
