Another report of a mysterious flying object in the sky over Cheltenham came to light today.

During the weekend two "flying saucers" were photographed over Charlton Kings. Last night another was seen by Mr. Robert Lewis, of 146 Clyde-crescent.

Mr. Lewis told the "Echo": "My father is very interested in astronomy, and last night I was out in the garden with him and my two brothers, studying the night sky. At approximately 11.15 we suddenly saw what I am convinced was a flying saucer.

"An object which looked like a red glowing light with a grey cigar shape underneath it flashed across the sky. It was quite unlike the way a 'plane travels. A 'plane flies in a smooth course and turns gradually.

FANTASTIC SPEED

"This object, however, flashed all over the sky at a fantastic speed.

"It travelled in one direction and then it would suddenly stop dead, hover, and then skim away in a different direction.

"I have been studying the stars regularly but I have never seen anything like this before. I was surprised and terrified to see this object which continued to hover over Cheltenham for about 25 minutes."

Reports of flying saucers Down Under

Sydney, Tuesday. — Fifty residents of the New South Wales township of Hay have seen an unidentified object resembling an upturned plate during the past week.

One of the residents, a member of the Royal Astronomical Society and an officer in the Royal Australian Navy Reserve, has passed on details of the object to a superior officer and it is understood they have been forwarded to Canberra.
