SPACESHIPS EXPLORING THE EARTH?

Sir.—Three responsible people have stated in your columns that they have seen what appeared to be a flying saucer or spaceship. A few years ago my wife watched a similar air vehicle hover over Tilford for ten minutes at approximately 2 a.m. It then went straight upwards and disappeared.

Her statement was confirmed by a clergyman.

My wife does not drink or smoke and has good eyesight. She says that it looked like a saucer seen from below and gave off a faint glow and a humming noise. During the last twenty years thousands of similar reports have been received from all over the world.

Some possibly are distant aircraft. But very few people would trouble to report anything that could possibly be aircraft.

As an experimental engineer I believe that there are spaceships cautiously exploring the earth from time to time. They probably take photographs, descend to low levels in thinly populated areas and, where safe to do so, possibly pick up samples of earth, water, vegetation, insects, etc.

What appears to be the rim on the bottom of a saucer could be an openable hatch. From my wife's description I believe that the vehicles are powered by a massive metal ring, on the outer edge, spinning at a fantastic speed. Hence the hum.

If so, they could not stay very long near the earth as the pull of gravity would use up much of their power, but in outer space they could travel enormous distances at fantastic speeds.

The latent power of large wheels or rings spinning at really high speeds has not yet been exploited on earth and may well be the answer to space travel.

Those Saucers

WHILE staying in Nice recently I spoke to a Frenchman on the subject of flying saucers and he presented me with his personal theories—some of which I will outline briefly:

That the people who made and use these objects are, at least, one million years ahead of us—and therefore consider us as mere savages who are

extremely warlike and liable to attack anyone whom they neither know nor understand.

This would mean a reluctance to land on earth and suffer possible injury—although doubtless they would have adequate means of defending themselves in such a contingency.

That these people come from a planet or galaxy not yet discovered by the largest earth telescope; and that they travel the universe as freely as we navigate the oceans.

These people would land in 1970 on the condition that a friendly welcome would be accorded to them—this, he said, was the information given to some people in Italy who were "in touch" with the inhabitants of the saucers.

I was sceptical on the last point—but since I have no means of proving or disproving it keep an open mind.

For some considerable time I have been convinced that flying saucers (wherever they come from and whoever controls them) are as real as the recent Mariner spacecraft sent round Mars by the Americans would seem to a primitive civilisation on Mars.
