# *Mystery* <sup>3404</sup> *object over* *Newport*

**M**R. EDWARD CLARK, of Julian Street, Newport, looked skyward on Sunday night and saw what he claimed was a flying saucer. He raced into the house for his binoculars and then spotted another.

And to prove to himself that he was not seeing things he called his wife, Rose, and she saw them, too. The time 10.45 p.m.

Mr. Clark is a sergeant instructor in the Territorial Army at Newport and has had experience in plotting plane courses. The first object was flying due south and the second in an easterly direction. Both were moving at about 3,000 m.p.h., he says.

## **Course**

"Suddenly," said Mr. Clark "the second object curved over an area of about 300 miles and joined the same course as the other one."

"It was just like a pin head glowing in the sky. But there was no sound," he said. "We have nothing on earth like this. If my calculations were correct they must have been about a mile long.

"It really frightened my wife," he said.

"Both my wife and I are convinced these were some sort of space ships" he said.
