

UFO in field, claim boys

FOURTEEN SCHOOLCHILDREN have claimed to UFO experts that a mystery craft landed near a village school in West Wales at the weekend.

They claim to have seen a large, silver-coloured machine in a field at Broad Haven, near Haverfordwest. They will be questioned about the sighting when they return to school today.

The South Wales co-ordinator for the British Unidentified Flying Objects Research Association, Mr. Randall Jones Pugh, of Roche, near Haverfordwest, spoke to some of the boys and then visited the field where they claimed to have seen the strange

machine. Their reports are now being studied by the association.

"They obviously saw something and it is all very puzzling," said Mr. Pugh.

The big object with a dome on the top was apparently seen by 14 pupils of the lower school.

Michael Webb, aged 10, of Little Haven, said, "Everyone is convinced that they saw something. It seems cigar-shaped with a large dome on the top. I saw what appeared to be red or orange red lights on it. It was on the ground and partly hidden behind some large bushes. I was frightened when I saw it. It was definitely not a helicopter."

David Davies, also aged 10, of Solbury, near Broad Haven, said that he heard some of the boys talking about the object and went to see it for himself. It was a few hundred yards from the school and he claims that he saw part of it shoot up as though it was trying to get off the ground.

But it seemed to be stuck. "I was with another boy at the time and we just ran," he said.

Last night the headmaster, Mr. Ralph Llewellyn, said that he would talk to the boys thoroughly about the matter today. None of the adults at the school had seen the object.

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More UFOs spotted by children

REPORTS OF new sightings in the Broad Haven area have backed up claims by several schoolchildren that a UFO landed in a field near their Dyfed school last week.

On the same day as they reported seeing the object in a field 300 yards from their school, a woman living in the same village claimed to have seen several bright lights in the sky.

And a group of 20 other schoolchildren at Hubberston, Milford Haven, have reported seeing a cigar-shaped object in the sky.

The latest sightings have been reported to the South Wales co-ordinator for the British Unidentified Flying Objects Research Association, Mr. Randall Jones Pugh, of Roche, near Haverfordwest.
