### Boys spot UFO

Three Salisbury school-boys are the latest to claim to have spotted a UFO.

The boys, all of whom go to Chafyn Grove School, were travelling to Salisbury last Thursday morning when they saw a white cigar-shaped object.

Thomas Holland, of Yew Tree Cottage, Broad Chalke, Nicholas Bellamy, of The Cottage, Bowerchalke, and Matthew Sexton of Netton Old Farm House, Bishopstone, were in Mr Holland's car travelling to school at about 8.15 p.m.

"I looked up and saw the object above Salisbury. It stayed there for a little while and then shot off quickly leaving a vapour trail," said Thomas.

The two other boys confirmed his sighting and added that it was white or silver and oval or cigar-shaped.

## FOUND IN A MINE, BUT ARE THEY FROM OUTER SPACE?

**SYDNEY:** Three perfectly shaped discs found buried in a south Australian coal mine are baffling geologists and exciting flying saucer researchers.

The objects, each five feet in diameter and estimated to be millions of years old, were at first thought to be huge fossilised shells.

But now that theory has been discarded. Adelaide marine expert Mr. Michael Lawrie said: "I have never seen anything like them. They are the identical colour of iron or steel which has been buried for a long, long time."

### Folk lore

What can they be? While the scientists continue their examination of the objects Mrs. Shirley Kemp, librarian for the Australian U.F.O. Research Society, said: "These discs could be the find of the century. Scientists believe the coal field where they were found was burned out by a blazing meteor thousands of years ago."

"And this theory of destruction by fire ties in with the folk lore of the aborigines. They have a legend that many years ago a giant craft came from the heavens and landed in that area."

## Red flare riddle
