Arresting sight in sky reported

TWO Gwent police officers say they have seen a UFO at Monmouth — the third such sighting in the county in just over a week.

The policemen say that as they watched, two red lights from the mysterious object fell to the ground.

Police-constables Simon Holder and Tim Banks were on patrol in Goldwire Lane, Monmouth, at 4am yesterday, when they saw a light in the sky.

Chief-inspector Keith Harris, at Monmouth, gave details of what the officers reported:

"They saw a light in the sky which started off approximately the size of a star, flashing blue, white and red. It was seen to separate into three white lights occasionally and then re-form into one light."

They had watched it for about twenty minutes, Chief-inspector Harris said. The policemen then moved to Rockfield Road to get a better view and within a few minutes saw the object or light rise very quickly, stop and then disappear.

He said he could only assume that a vehicle of unknown origin was in the area.

A pulsating bright light was reported to have flown over Cwmbran on September 14 and a cottage loaf-shaped object was reported over the town on September 20.
