## 'Green beam' UFO spotted

THERE has been another UFO sighting in Gwent, the fourth in a fortnight.

Monmouth police say the latest sighting was by Mr R. L. Marshall of Pistyll Farm, Llanarth, near Raglan, a passenger in a vehicle travelling along the A40 near Chart House, Abergavenny, at 7pm.

He saw a beam of green light, about the size of a searchlight beam, and it was approximately a mile away. The sky was cloudy with clear patches and it was dry at the time.

Last week two Monmouth police officers reported seeing a light in the sky about the size of a star, flashing blue, white and red.

And a pulsating bright light was reported to have flown over Cwmbran on September 14 and a cottage-loaf shaped object was reported over the town on September 20.
