# More UFOs are spotted

**THREE** further sightings of unidentified flying objects in Gwent have been reported to the police — bringing the total to six in just over a week.

The new claims came on Thursday night in separate incidents in the New Inn, Pontypool and Griffithstown areas of the county, from "quite sensible and sane people," said a police spokesman.

The first report came from Mr Stuart Blake, who said he had watched white flashing discs in the sky with the naked eye and binoculars for 35 minutes

from a friend's house in St Augustine Road, Griffithstown. This was at about 8.30pm.

Within an hour Mrs Doreen Phillips, of Gower Green, Croseyceiliog, saw a bright blue light in the sky which was said to be static and shimmering.

The final sighting came from Golf Road, New Inn, where Mrs Mary Gauntlett, her daughter and a friend watched a narrow green band of light moving across the sky.

Two policemen at Monmouth reported sightings last week. They said their UFO appeared to have landed at one stage.
