Icke 'solves' crop-circle mystery

SELF-STYLED "Son of God" David Icke yesterday called on the nation to take to the fields and save the planet.

Stepping into the great crop circle debate, he claimed they are the "last desperate attempt by the spirit of the earth to ask creation for help before it is too late."

The former television sports presenter previously hit the headlines with his claim that he

was spirit of the Son of God and predicted disasters would sweep across the world.

In a statement to the Press Association yesterday, he gave his explanation of the crop circles which have baffled experts for many years and returned recently to parts of England.

He said the circles were symbols which were part of the "universal language" being sent to other planets.

"The crop symbols that have

appeared over the last few years with increasing complexity are the last desperate attempt by the spirit of the earth to ask creation for help before it is too late."

However, all may not be lost as man, according to the Mr Icke, has a role to play.

"The public are invited by the Godhead to visit the crop shapes and send thoughts of love (positive energies) to the earth spirit.

"It is vital that only thoughts of love are produced in the

symbols because if there is any hate, anger, sadness, fear etc this will send negative energies to the earth, the very energies that threaten her existence."

According to a newspaper report yesterday Mr Icke was seen running around a corn circle at Stratton's Farm, Alton Barnes, Wiltshire.

A farm worker reportedly saw Icke, dressed in a turquoise tracksuit, go into the field after other sightseers had left.
