

LOBBY: UFOlogists plan to descend on Parliament with proof of alien landings

Is there anybody out there? (would they please call Earth)

UFOLOGISTS are planning a mass lobby of Parliament in a bid to force the government to accept there is something Out There.

ET enthusiasts claim aliens have landed, had a scout round and even ravaged a few cattle. But the government will not admit it.

Alien experts believe John Major's government has covered up evidence of UFOs and landings for fear of sparking public panic.

But now star-gazers are building evidence to prove their case.

Kerry Blower and husband Tom are South Wales representatives of the Alien Acknowledgement Committee (AAC), which is campaigning for Government recognition of extra-terrestrials.

The Blowers, from Croesyceffog, Cwmbran, Gwent, have been collecting a dossier of sightings after they witnessed strange orange lights making crop circles in Wiltshire in 1990.

The AAC have already won the support of David Icke, who has written a book about ETs.

"He is one of the few people prepared to speak out about this, but he is condemned as a nutter," said Mrs Blower, 31.

Mr and Mrs Blower, singers in a duo called The Genetics, were knocked for six by their sightings, which took place four years ago.

"When I saw them it made my mind go whoosh! I decided then I wouldn't rest until I found out what these things are," said Mrs Blower. "There have been so many sightings and videos made of UFOs, there must be something to it."

Mrs Blower and her 42-year-old husband are trying to gather support for a demonstration outside the House of Commons on May 23 at which they will present evidence of sightings to MPs. There are also demonstrations planned across the USA in April and May. The Blowers'

evidence includes details of 3,500 sightings by military personnel worldwide.

In October 1989, the official Soviet news agency Tass said scientists had confirmed a spaceship manned by giant aliens, four metres tall and with tiny heads, had landed in a park in the Russian city of Voronezh.

"I think the government are just worried there would be panic if they admit aliens have landed," Mrs Blower said.

"There would be economic chaos, religions would break down, it could be like War of the Worlds."

Encounters close to home

MRS BLOWER says there have been hundreds of sightings of aliens in Wales, though only a few people are prepared to state on record that they have seen a UFO. Sightings include:

APRIL 1977: Mark Marsden, a 12-year-old Millford Haven schoolboy, who said he was chased home by a gleaming 10ft creature dressed in silver with a black square where its head should have been.

APRIL 19, 1977: Mrs Rose Granville saw an oval shaped object in the sky and then two tall figures clad all in white from head to toe. In October Mrs Granville, of the Haven Fort Hotel, Marloes, spotted a pulsating, glowing saucer-like object circling above Stock Rock, St Bride's Bay.

AUGUST 27, 1977: Lorry driver Francis Lloyd saw 7ft-tall humanoids on Nantycaws Hill, near Carmarthen, Dyfed.

JANUARY 1979: Colin Webbley, of Caerphilly, spotted a cigar-shaped object giving off a brilliant white light.

SEPTEMBER 1982: Amateur astronomer Ron Tredrey, of Whitchurch, Cardiff, spotted a pulsating white light which changed colour to blue and red as it flew over the Bristol Channel.

JANUARY 27, 1988: A man from Pyle, who insisted on remaining anonymous, told reporters he had spotted a large object in the sky over Meadow Street, North Connelly. He said it was the size of three maisonettes with three rows of different coloured lights.

OCTOBER 1988: Mecha vic Tony Silvestri was driving home with his wife and daughter from Lampeter to Cilau Aeron. When they drove past the theatre at Felin Fach he said the whole car was lit up by a brilliant greenish light that was so bright he couldn't see out of the windscreen.
