Women spooked by mystery UFO

THEY are out there — somewhere over Gower.

It's a mystery that Mulder and Scully, of X-Files fame, may want to investigate — UFOs spotted in the Swansea sky.

They were seen by Christine Harvey, aged 56, from Nicholaston and 32-year-old Charlotte Williams, from Pennard, as they made their way to work last Friday evening.

The pair were pulling up to an address in Scurlage when they saw two triangular shapes in the night sky.

Christine said: "We were travelling up a country lane when Charlotte said, 'What are those?' The other side of the hedge, on the right hand side of us, higher up the lane, were two white lights.

"They did not move and there was no sound. We were not frightened and must have stayed looking curiously at them for perhaps a minute or two.

"Quite bewildered about it all, we decided to get on with our work."

After parking they saw the lights again.

"There, not very high above us and quite near in distance were two triangle shapes in lights. Six lights to each triangle all white. It was awesome.

"I was the first to get out of the car. For what seemed a long time, probably

"I have never been interested or believed in UFOs. Charlotte and I remain baffled by what we saw. Whatever answer someone can come up with, may explain a very awesome, baffling and after the event, a spooky

experience," said Christine.

A police spokesman said: "We haven't received any reports of UFOs or other strange lights over Gower.

"To be honest, I can't remember ever hearing about UFOs being reported to the police."
