

# Mysterious lights seen across South Wales skies

SIGHTINGS of mysterious lights seen in the sky on Boxing Day have been reported across South Wales.

Following a report in yesterday's paper, Ann Forward, 71, said she saw the same bright orange lights through her window in Sarn, near Bridgend, that were first seen above Penarth by Echo reader Martin Sells.

Mrs Forward saw the lights at a similar time to Mr Sells at just before 7pm on Boxing Day.

She said: "I was in my parlour and I looked out and I saw these two lights come in one after the other.

"I thought they were coming from over Cefn Glas but then all of a sudden they faded away and all of a sudden they came back and then disappeared altogether."

She added: "I thought I was seeing things. It was very clear. It was like a light orange.

"I even told my daughter to come and look because she was watching TV in the living room."

Mrs Forward's sighting was almost identical to that of Mr Sells, who lives in Sundew Close, Penarth.

Mr Sells reported seeing a trio of bright orange lights in a pattern similar to the Mercedes Benz logo at 6.45pm on Boxing Day.

Grace Brown, 66, also saw lights above her house in Elm Street, Roath, Cardiff, on Christmas Day.

The pensioner said she saw a single, orange-red light when she was standing outside in her garden with her son and his partner at just after 6.30pm.

"I saw it on Christmas Day. We live in Roath.

"I was out in the garden with my son, who was having a cigarette.

"I looked and there was this orange light. It was around 6.30pm, maybe 6.45pm. There were three of us who saw it. It was quite high up in the sky.

"It looked like a big round, orange light. It wasn't a star. We were looking at it, saying 'that's strange' and with that it disappeared.

"It definitely wasn't a helicopter or anything like that."

Police said they had received no reports of unusual lights in the sky.
