## Two films to focus on nuclear threat

CAMDEN — Winner of the Best Video Documentary Award, education category, "In the Nuclear Shadow: What Can the Children Tell Us?" and Dr. Helen Caldicott's "The Crossroads of Time" will be shown starting at 4 p.m. Sunday, Oct. 28, at the Bay View Cinema. Admission will be free, courtesy of W. Douglas Hall.

"In the Nuclear Shadow" features 27 children ages 6-18 of various races and socio-economic backgrounds expressing their responses to the danger of nuclear war, and their positive message. Statements from psychiatrists Dr. Robert J. Lifton of Yale Medical School and Dr. John E. Mack of Harvard are included in the 26-minute film.

"The Crossroads of Time" is a 50-minute assessment of the arms race and the political, moral and ethical choices before us, using visuals and music to bring across its positive message.

Parents, teachers, students and voters are urged to see these films, sponsored by Maine People Concerned and Women's Action for Nuclear Disarmament.
