

# Hey you, get off of my cloud

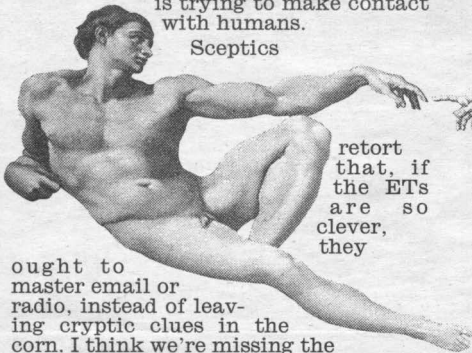
THE images which have appeared in a Hampshire cornfield – an alien face and a stream of binary data – are too complex to be called crop circles.

## MIND POWER

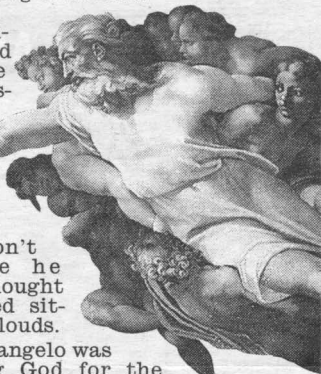
