I think it's important to keep in mind that the distances between stars are so vast

106

that if you're traveling in the conventional sense

and if you're restricted by the universal speed limit of the speed of light,

108

00:06:50,000 --> 00:06:54,000

300,000 kilometers per second, it's a high speed,

109

00:06:54,000 --> 00:07:00,000

but even at that incredible pace, it takes years to cross the distance

110

00:07:00,000 --> 00:07:03,000

between even the nearest neighbouring stars.

111

00:07:03,000 --> 00:07:08,000

Our fastest space probes would take tens of thousands of years

112

to reach the nearest neighbouring stars.

113

So if people had a real intuition for interstellar distances,

114

they would probably think more carefully about how likely it is

115

00:07:23,000 --> 00:07:27,000

that aliens are traversing those distances to visit us

116

00:07:27,000 --> 00:07:29,000

and how often they would do it.

117

Not saying it's impossible, but it's not as easy as it looks.

118

You know, maybe if we have visitors, they're not coming from another place

119

in our three-dimensional spatial universe.

120

Maybe they're coming from another set of dimensions within a much larger multiverse.

121

There could be many, many dimensions of space and time,

122

of which our three spatial dimensions and our one temporal dimension are just a subset of them.

Okay, this is really weird because this now makes me think of what happened as a child.

180

Karina fears she may have been abducted by aliens.

219

But she doesn't know that.

220

Weeks after witnessing a large object hovering over her house

221

in Aldergrove, British Columbia,

222

00:16:04,000 --> 00:16:07,000

things take a nightmarish turn.

223

What I saw, literally, was this being

224

about three feet tall, I guess,

225

pear-shaped head, kind of grayish color.

226

I felt terrified.

There was a feeling, a sense, that I'd seen him before,

228

I was brought up Catholic.

246

So there's God, there's this, there's that,

247

00:17:38,000 --> 00:17:40,000

and then all of a sudden, well, who are we?

248

Where are we really from?

249

00:17:42,000 --> 00:17:46,000

Who are these beings, and what is it all about?

250

00:17:46,000 --> 00:17:48,000

Where are we here?

251

00:17:48,000 --> 00:17:52,000

And then you feel absolutely and totally alone.

252

Dr. Caleb Schurf runs the Astrobiology Center

253

00:17:57,000 --> 00:17:59,000

at Columbia University,

254

00:17:59,000 --> 00:18:02,000

looking for clues as to whether or not

255

00:18:02,000 --> 00:18:04,000

there's life beyond Earth.

256

00:18:05,000 --> 00:18:09,000

We are trying very, very hard in modern science today

257

00:18:09,000 --> 00:18:13,000

to find out whether or not we are genuinely alone

258

00:18:13,000 --> 00:18:16,000

in our solar system or alone in the universe as a whole.

259

00:18:16,000 --> 00:18:20,000

So until very recently, we just didn't know for sure

260

00:18:20,000 --> 00:18:23,000

that there are other planets around other stars.

261

00:18:26,000 --> 00:18:29,000

With modern technology, we've been able to eke out

262

00:18:29,000 --> 00:18:32,000

the signatures of planets around other stars.

263

00:18:32,000 --> 00:18:36,000

The fact that there are so many planets out there

264

00:18:36,000 --> 00:18:39,000

is quite surprising, because it means that

265

00:18:39,000 --> 00:18:43,000

planets form incredibly efficiently in this galaxy

266

00:18:43,000 --> 00:18:45,000

and probably in the universe as a whole.

267

00:18:45,000 --> 00:18:49,000

And that means that the opportunity for there to be planets

268

00:18:49,000 --> 00:18:54,000

a bit like the Earth or somehow similar enough to harbour life

269

00:18:54,000 --> 00:18:56,000

goes up enormously.

270

00:18:56,000 --> 00:19:00,000

I think we're sitting at 763.

271

00:19:01,000 --> 00:19:03,000

Confirmed planets.

272

00:19:03,000 --> 00:19:07,000

And more than 2,000 candidate planets.

273

00:19:09,000 --> 00:19:11,000

Our galaxy is packed with planets.

274

00:19:11,000 --> 00:19:13,000

There are more planets than stars.

275

00:19:13,000 --> 00:19:15,000

And we didn't know that a few years ago.

276

00:19:15,000 --> 00:19:19,000

And among those planets are a huge number of smaller planets

277

00:19:19,000 --> 00:19:24,000

that may be rocky, terrestrial-like planets a bit like the Earth.

278

00:19:26,000 --> 00:19:28,000

The Goldilocks Zone, which is sometimes called

279

00:19:28,000 --> 00:19:32,000

the habitable zone, is the region around a star

280

00:19:32,000 --> 00:19:36,000

where if you placed a planet like the Earth,

281

00:19:36,000 --> 00:19:39,000

it has the possibility of having a surface temperature

282

00:19:39,000 --> 00:19:42,000

somewhere between the freezing point and the boiling point of water.

283

00:19:42,000 --> 00:19:45,000

In other words, it's at the right distance from the star

284

00:19:45,000 --> 00:19:47,000
