I was a senior analyst and most of my responsibility was to analyze how well the ejection seats and the crew modules worked to see if the crew would be injured, killed, or if they would be safe.

When you were there, did you hear any talk about a landing at Holloman Air Force Base for a flying saucer?

211

The one I know about occurred in February 1955.

212

President Eisenhower flew from Washington to Holloman. He landed on the North-South runway.

213

There were two saucers. One was about 200 feet in front of Air Force One.

214

The other one stayed about 300 feet up.

215

00:14:35,000 --> 00:14:39,000

There was a ramp. It came out of the UFO.

Eisenhower walked up the ramp, shook hands with somebody, and then went inside, and he was inside for about 45 minutes.

Now, do you know that what you're saying sounds absolutely nuts?

Does it really?

So this is the guy whose eyes I want to be viewing through

347

Can you tell us a little bit about your background in the military?

I served 22 and a half years in the United States Army.

And I knew that that wasn't human.

Did you ever have it confirmed?

So we're going to go meet this geologist, Frank Kimbler,

and has pulled out what he thinks may be the first scientific evidence

of extraterrestrial debris.

Frank?

and nobody wanted to tell me where the location was.

434

And what exactly do you mean by location?

435

There's this debris field and it's out by the windmill

436

00:28:06,000 --> 00:28:09,000

and that was what I honed in for.

437

That's what I was trying to find.

438

So I had to do some research to find that.

439

After I found the location, I started pulling out the aerial photographs

440

and I noticed this area right here

441

and it shows up as kind of a squared off burn area, which is unusual

442

00:28:25,000 --> 00:28:28,000

because they usually don't square off.

443

So they kind of curved.

444

00:28:30,000 --> 00:28:33,000

And what struck me unique was the fact that the description of the debris field

445

00:28:33,000 --> 00:28:37,000

was that it was several hundred yards wide and it was three-quarters of a mile long

446

00:28:37,000 --> 00:28:42,000

and I'm going, oh my gosh, and it just so happens that this thing is sitting smack dab in the middle

447

00:28:42,000 --> 00:28:44,000

of what the description was.

448

00:28:44,000 --> 00:28:48,000

So what would be the purpose of burning an area like this?

449

00:28:48,000 --> 00:28:52,000

Destroy evidence.

450

00:28:52,000 --> 00:28:55,000

So you mean the equivalent of like throwing bleach on a crime scene?

451

00:28:55,000 --> 00:28:57,000

That's right. And I started looking at this and I'm going,

452

00:28:57,000 --> 00:29:01,000

I'm going to center my hunting area kind of like in the center of that

453

00:29:01,000 --> 00:29:02,000

and that's what I did.

454

00:29:02,000 --> 00:29:05,000

I drove out there with a metal detector, a good one.

455

00:29:05,000 --> 00:29:09,000

I wanted to look at the low areas where the runoff was, typical geology things

456

00:29:09,000 --> 00:29:17,000

and as the sun was going down in an anthill, there was this shiny little piece of metal.

457

00:29:17,000 --> 00:29:20,000

I about had a heart attack

458

00:29:20,000 --> 00:29:25,000

and this is the material I found.

459

00:29:25,000 --> 00:29:28,000

Oh wow.

460

00:29:28,000 --> 00:29:31,000

Some of them are very hard, some of them are a little bit soft,

461

00:29:31,000 --> 00:29:35,000

so there might be two or three different kinds of metallic things that are out there.

462

00:29:35,000 --> 00:29:42,000

If you've ever seen like aluminum cans out in the bonis, aluminum cans don't look like this.

463

00:29:42,000 --> 00:29:47,000

Frank just pulled out little pieces of metal, which could very likely be from a spaceship,

464

00:29:47,000 --> 00:29:51,000

crashed at Roswell, New Mexico in 1947.

465

00:29:51,000 --> 00:29:54,000

What if what this guy has is from another world?

466

00:29:54,000 --> 00:29:58,000

The implications of that are earth shattering.

467

00:29:58,000 --> 00:30:03,000

They might have got the big stuff, but that tiny little stuff gets wedged down in the cracks

468

00:30:03,000 --> 00:30:09,000

and I think in any UFO crash site, any place in the world that people say they've cleaned it up

469

00:30:09,000 --> 00:30:12,000

and there's nothing there, I think it's a bunch of baloney.

470

00:30:12,000 --> 00:30:19,000

Frank has used solid field science to help him find what may be pieces of metal debris.

471

00:30:19,000 --> 00:30:25,000

However, before I'm going to jump to any conclusions about whether or not the metal is terrestrial

472

00:30:25,000 --> 00:30:28,000

or extraterrestrial in nature, we've got to get more data.

473

00:30:28,000 --> 00:30:32,000

We've got to do more analysis on more of those fragments to see if it's consistent.

474

00:30:32,000 --> 00:30:35,000

Is the snow going to hinder us at all?

475

00:30:35,000 --> 00:30:39,000

Well, it certainly impedes lying in the site.

476

00:30:39,000 --> 00:30:45,000

It's good it's on a slope, got a natural grade.

477

00:30:45,000 --> 00:30:47,000

Okay, so Frank this is?

478

00:30:47,000 --> 00:30:49,000

Is ground zero?

479

00:30:49,000 --> 00:30:50,000

You're in it.

480

00:30:50,000 --> 00:30:52,000

This is where it hit right here.

481

00:30:52,000 --> 00:30:56,000

It probably came in like this and then skipped.

482

00:30:56,000 --> 00:30:58,000

So this is the point of impact right here?

483

00:30:58,000 --> 00:31:03,000

Yeah, right here near the top of the hill and right down through the valley.

484

00:31:03,000 --> 00:31:08,000

While there's been decades of speculation as to what exactly crashed at Roswell in Mexico,

485

00:31:08,000 --> 00:31:14,000

the one thing that everyone agrees on is that there was a debris field from something that impacted the site,

486

00:31:14,000 --> 00:31:18,000

skipped and kept going and eventually crashed at a different location.

487

00:31:18,000 --> 00:31:22,000

Very similar to the object we saw crashing in the video at White Sands.

488

00:31:25,000 --> 00:31:29,000

Where was the last place that you found some of the debris?

489

00:31:29,000 --> 00:31:34,000

Just to the right of the base of the hill and then there was some of it that was up this way as well.

490

00:31:34,000 --> 00:31:38,000

So this is where we're in the middle of where we found this.

491

00:31:38,000 --> 00:31:39,000

So what do you think, Ben?

492

00:31:39,000 --> 00:31:43,000

I'd say we set up our survey grid and found out as far as we can get.

493

00:31:43,000 --> 00:31:47,000

So the runoff would take some of the debris, wash it down here.

494

Send it on down with time.

495

00:31:50,000 --> 00:31:55,000

Well, we're losing daylight so why don't we drop our gear and start surveying?

496

Let's get the survey started.

497

Yeah.

498

00:32:02,000 --> 00:32:06,000

Alright, all metal because we don't know what these things are made of.

499

Right now we're hitting near a lot of metal obviously because of our gear somewhere on this area right here.

500

Okay, while they're getting the area surveyed, let's head up to the latest hotspot.

501

How's it going over there, James?

502

I could stay out here for weeks because I know there's debris out here.

I seriously feel like a prospector prospecting for gold right now.

Or I feel like a 65 year old man on the beach in my speedo.

505

This is like my Disneyland, I swear to you.

506

The fact that we have two geologists out here with us to help guide us through the process

507

and the fact that Frank has already found debris is just so exciting to me.

508

Wow, got something?

Yeah, you do.

510

I got something!
