This is all public knowledge. And under Texas law, any water that he can reach under his land, he gets it for free.

It's not regulated nearly as carefully as his domestic water use, which has to comply with the Safe Drinking Water Act.

298

You know, we really can't say because the companies that are bottling and taking the water out of the Great Lakes don't really disclose that.

Well, I was going to find out coming in and buying up water is just plain capitalism.

Sneaking it out in cargo ships or bottles, sending it to other countries where it can be stockpiled, adding poisons to the water, that's a conspiracy.

Daniel's assignment was the Stanwood bottling plant.

343

He couldn't miss it.

344

00:28:26,000 --> 00:28:29,000

Mine wasn't so obvious.

345

Those pumps out in the middle of the woods, in secret where nobody can see or hear them sucking the lakes dry.

346

00:28:43,000 --> 00:28:48,000

I picked up a guide in Traverse City.

347

00:28:48,000 --> 00:28:53,000

Chris Swire is a local guy who led the fight against the giant corporation.

348

00:28:53,000 --> 00:28:58,000

He thought it was a good idea if we brought along some security.

349

00:28:58,000 --> 00:29:02,000

You never know what's out there in the woods.

350

00:29:03,000 --> 00:29:09,000

So what they're doing now, they're going off to these remote places and drawing off the water.

351

Because now they can't directly take from the great lakes, right?

352

Correct.

353

So the way they're getting around it is by drilling and pumping out the water that goes into the lake.

Daniel showed up at the plant with someone the water people would recognize.

355

Don Roy has been in their face, fighting their plans to take even more water.

356

It's the Nestle Waters of North America bottling plant and it's been here for about 10 years now.

357

They actually started building it when we were in trial.

358

00:29:50,000 --> 00:29:51,000

What was the trial?

359

00:29:51,000 --> 00:29:55,000

Michigan Citizens for Water Conservation filed a lawsuit.

360

00:29:55,000 --> 00:29:59,000

Our lawsuit was based upon environmental harm, real environmental harm.

361

00:29:59,000 --> 00:30:06,000

Of course we found a significant drop in flow and levels to a stream, wetlands and two lakes.

362

00:30:06,000 --> 00:30:07,000

How much water are we talking about?

363

00:30:07,000 --> 00:30:12,000

Somewhere around 90 million gallons from one pumping site.

364

00:30:12,000 --> 00:30:13,000

90 million gallons a year?

365

00:30:13,000 --> 00:30:15,000

Yes, from one pumping site.

366

00:30:15,000 --> 00:30:18,000

So what kind of environmental impacts literally have there been?

367

There were no fish.

368

00:30:22,000 --> 00:30:26,000

Dead fish? How about a dead stream?

369

Me and my special team were working our way to the pumps when we got to stare down the environmental damage.

370

The dead stream.

371

00:30:38,000 --> 00:30:41,000

And that's the official name for it.

372

A lot of the hydrologists and environmental experts have shown that Nestle's pumping upstream has affected what's happening here in this dead stream.

373

And what are they doing in the plant?

374

Daniel went to the gate and one of the employees came out.

375

You're working, you're just working.

376

If you have a pump, I can give you information.

377

You can't tell me?

378

00:31:10,000 --> 00:31:12,000

No, that's for the pump.

379

00:31:12,000 --> 00:31:15,000

There's controversial about water.

380

00:31:15,000 --> 00:31:18,000

About the water.

381

00:31:18,000 --> 00:31:25,000

And frankly the right to someone who should be able to make a problem with this in the deep.

382

There's nothing I can ask you, there's nothing you can tell me.

383

00:31:29,000 --> 00:31:34,000

I guarantee it, but I will go back and call and I'll be back soon because I can.

384

The water boy went inside, but not to set up a tour.

385

Too many questions meant one thing.

He called the cops.

387

Try calling 911 and getting a response this quick.

388

They called me saying that you guys were filming the plant, it's a concern.

390

Obviously it's not a critical infrastructure, it's not a government infrastructure.

It's a local business, right?

392

00:32:08,000 --> 00:32:10,000

Yeah, I mean it's something we're interested in.

I'll put it this way, you guys are going to be in a report.

Meanwhile, we've made it to the place where Nestle was pumping all the Great Lakes water out of the ground.

Yeah, that's part of the problem.

This isn't a sanctuary, it looks more like a crime scene.

There were no answers here.

Whatever they were doing, wherever the water was going, was locked behind tall fences.

404

So I took it to the top.

Washington, D.C.

406

I was going to face the real power in this town.

407

Not the government, a lobbyist.

408

Michael Dean is the director of the National Association of Water Companies.

409

He represents bottlers and privatizers.

410

Turns out he's from Minnesota too.

411

00:33:24,000 --> 00:33:26,000

Maybe he thought we'd bond.

412

Fat chance.

413

Is there a conspiracy out there to control the world's water?

414

None at all.

415

No.

Do bottled water companies bottle your tap water and sell it to the public?

417

They don't just take it rough, they put it through reverse osmosis, further treatment,

and put it into the bottle and then sell it.

And if that's a business that's viable for them, it's a business that's viable for them.

420

And if they're not going to sell it, they're going to sell it.

421

And if that's a business that's viable for them and someone wants to...

422

Well, they've obviously done a good sell job on it.

They sell it more expensive than gasoline.

They're charging over a dollar a quart.

Does your tap water cost a dollar a quart to reproduce?

And she's known internationally as an expert on radiation and public health.

474

Lauren More told me she's found uranium in our drinking water, along with the lithium Alex Jones warned about.

475

Lithium is used for people with bipolar disorder or manic depressive.

476

00:38:07,000 --> 00:38:10,000

It slows down and calms the brain.

477

00:38:10,000 --> 00:38:13,000

It makes the person docile.

478

Since uranium is an estrogen and a hormone disruptor, the female population is expanding and the male population is shrinking.

479

We're being neutered.

480

Not only that, the population is growing.

481

Not only that, the plastic that the water is in, the bottle, has chemicals that change the estrogen and the testosterone.
