but it was also transported through time

223

from the Philadelphia shipyard to Norfolk, Virginia.

224

There are about 33 men aboard the craft.

225

When the experiment ended, they found that some men apparently had disappeared.

226

I've heard rumors of this for a long time, but what is the proof?

Well, I heard that was one of those situations

258

where they weren't sure if he had killed himself or he was...

259

00:12:52,000 --> 00:12:56,000

That's absolutely what the suicide or perhaps some governmental agents killed him

260

00:12:56,000 --> 00:13:00,000

because he was getting too close to the truth and might have revealed it.

261

June Sarpong tracks down Preston Nichols.

271

Suppressed and tell me what was the Montauk project?

272

The attempt to change the course of history by sending people like him through time.

521

I mean, what are your background? Who are you?

522

Well, I'm a lawyer from Washington state, and in the late 1960s and early 1970s,

523

00:26:57,000 --> 00:27:02,000

I was one of the 140 American school children who were attached to DARPA's Project Pegasus.

524

American school children?

525

00:27:04,000 --> 00:27:09,000

At that time, the U.S. government was working with children roughly age 7 to 11.

526

They had developed a technology that essentially opened up

527

vortical tunnels in the fabric of time space, and they technically needed

528

00:27:16,000 --> 00:27:19,000

small, cooperative, intelligent human beings.

From Santa Fe, Bashago says his father took him to the Sandia National Laboratories,

538

One of the places they sent us was to the Revolutionary War period.

540

00:28:10,000 --> 00:28:14,000

And in at least one case, influenced history.

541

We were literally in George Washington's encampment to advise him to retreat from New York Harbor.

542

00:28:20,000 --> 00:28:24,000

Oh, so the generals from today were sending you guys back?

543

00:28:24,000 --> 00:28:26,000

Well, they weren't the generals.

544

00:28:26,000 --> 00:28:31,000

They were just the defense technical people and CIA people aligned with Project Pegasus.

545

00:28:31,000 --> 00:28:34,000

How did you get access to General Washington at the time?

546

00:28:34,000 --> 00:28:39,000

Well, when they turned the device on, we popped into view literally in his encampment.

547

00:28:39,000 --> 00:28:44,000

He was sitting there, a very august gentleman, and I remember he was kind of looking at us with some mirth.

548

He kind of said, well, what am I to presume you are, lads, angels?

549

553

554

And your father and family were totally cool with sending their 8-year-old child through time space?

555

Well, my father certainly was because he was one of the Project Principals.

556

The other Principals? Bishago names names, including a future Defense Secretary.

557

Don Rumsfeld was the Defense Attaché to Project Pegasus,

558

and he told us that the purpose of teleportation was primarily military.

559

It was going to enable us to put troops precisely where they were needed on the battlefield.

560

And there's one more name he offers, almost in passing.

561

Barack Obama was one of the 140 schoolchildren involved in Project Pegasus.

Did you know Obama would become president?

565

He was clearly identified as a future American president.

566

Actually, one of the things that was going on is the project was briefing future presidents.

567

This is the photo everyone's been talking about.

819

00:40:35,000 --> 00:40:39,000

It's been in the public domain for more than 50 years,

820

00:40:39,000 --> 00:40:41,000

way before Photoshop.

821

00:40:41,000 --> 00:40:43,000

And it hasn't been retouched.

822

00:40:43,000 --> 00:40:46,000

Abraham Lincoln is in the crowd back there.

823

00:40:46,000 --> 00:40:50,000

Andrew Bissago said he's the kid in the center.

824

00:40:50,000 --> 00:40:54,000

This lad here, which is me, was wearing grossly oversized shoes.

825

00:40:54,000 --> 00:40:57,000

For any ear, I mean, they're large men's street shoes.

826

00:40:57,000 --> 00:41:00,000

I had lost my hat, both shoes, and a sock.

827

00:41:00,000 --> 00:41:05,000

So when I walked into town, a man came up and fitted me with the shoes.

828

00:41:05,000 --> 00:41:07,000

He'd got me a Union winter parka.

829

00:41:07,000 --> 00:41:09,000

How can you prove that?

830

You can see the cylinder there on my right hand,

831

which were instructions to the secretary of the Navy, Gideon Wells.

if I was in trouble in the field.

You can actually see that cylinder in my hand.

835

Here's the comparison.

836

Andrew Bissago and that kid at Gettysburg,

837

the one who's a little taller and fuller than the others.

838

Photo analysts have taken my sixth grade portrait from fall of 1972,

839

00:41:39,000 --> 00:41:43,000

which would have been about six months after this photograph was taken.

840

00:41:43,000 --> 00:41:46,000

And there's a direct correlation between the shape of the head and the shoulders

841

00:41:46,000 --> 00:41:48,000

and so forth to this child here.

842

00:41:48,000 --> 00:41:51,000

That's me in 1863.

843

00:41:51,000 --> 00:41:53,000

Well, so that is literally...

844

00:41:53,000 --> 00:41:56,000

I can only accept your word on it because as I look on it,

845

I can't identify that it's you, but you do look kind of out of place.

846

And so this is not only the only photograph to show Lincoln at Gettysburg,

847

but it's the first photograph to show a time traveler from the future.
