The Army Corps of Engineers announces a plan to divert the Chattahoochee River

50

to a rural region in northern Georgia and create a nearly 60-square-mile man-made lake.

It will ease flooding concerns, provide hydroelectric power and drinking water,

52

and a recreation area for the community.

53

But to accomplish this,

54

the government will need to relocate several remote towns,

55

00:03:20,000 --> 00:03:29,000

along with their houses, businesses, family farms, churches, and yes, 20 cemeteries.

56

It's this last item and the nearly 1,000 bodies contained in graves throughout the area

57

that proves the most problematic and controversial.

When the waters of the Chattahoochee flood the foothills and valleys,

locals question how or even if the bodies were properly exhumed and reinterred.

Some say the lake is now cursed and strange accidents begin to plague the region.

One of these incidents is said to be the origin of Lake Lanier's most famous ghost.

Delia Young and her friend Susie Roberts are driving home after a night out

63

and approach a newly built bridge over the lake.

According to legend, an invisible force grabs onto their car,

which loses control and plummets into the deep waters of Lake Lanier.

Soon after, locals begin to report sightings of a ghostly young woman in a blue dress.

67

Exactly what Delia was wearing the night she died.

68

Since then, sightings of the so-called Lady of the Lake

69

have corresponded with accidents and disappearances in and around Lanier.

A female phantom manifesting the power of the countless spirits

disturbed by the creation of the lake.

There you have it. This is considered the most haunted lake in the world.

The natural lakes have erosion.

82

The bottom of the lake is easier to navigate when you're boating around.

Man-made lakes have really uncertain topography down there.

They just flooded this area so there could still be debris.

There could be strange currents.

There could be dead bodies.

87

Phil, haven't you seen Poltergeist?

88

I have not.

Phil, I don't want to ruin it for you, but they moved the headstones to their bodies.

Can we just pause for a minute while we make Phil watch this movie?

I mean, this is very uncertain ground down there.

there are triple the amount of fatalities and accidents on this lake

103

as the next most active lake in Georgia.

That's a huge difference.

Do you think topography could account for all that?

106

I think something can, and I think it's going to be a real world explanation.

The team travels 850 miles from New York City to Lake Lanier in northern Georgia.

127

00:07:01,000 --> 00:07:05,000

Just 50 miles north of Atlanta, this pristine body of water

128

00:07:05,000 --> 00:07:11,000

known as Georgia's inland ocean, provides the tap water for nearly 6 million people.

129

00:07:11,000 --> 00:07:16,000

Its water may be the elixir of life, but it's the depths in and around the lake

130

00:07:16,000 --> 00:07:18,000

that have drawn attention to it.

131

00:07:21,000 --> 00:07:23,000

Here we are. Lake Lanier.

132

00:07:23,000 --> 00:07:26,000

It is crazy to think what's under there right now.

133

00:07:26,000 --> 00:07:28,000

Yeah, bodies.

134

00:07:29,000 --> 00:07:32,000

People are getting hurt and dying on that lake.

135

The team is starting its investigation with eyewitness Rachel Sanders.

136

A few weeks ago, she was swimming in Lake Lanier

137

00:07:40,000 --> 00:07:44,000

when she had an experience that she could only describe as paranormal.

138

00:07:44,000 --> 00:07:46,000

Can you walk us through it?

139

I was here training for a triathlon.

140

I've trained on this lake my whole life, and that day was something different.

141

I was swimming and kept hearing this shrill shriek.

142

And I felt this force.

Something pulling me deeper into the water, and everything went black.

I woke up on the shore.

145

On this island, I had no idea how I got there.

146

Then I saw a woman in the water, wearing a blue dress, and I was terrified.

I didn't want to go back in the water, so I went up to the high point of the island

148

That to me sounds like it could be something like a crazy current.

No. No.

I've swam in this lake my entire life.

152

I've trained in it in worse conditions than it was that day,

153

and I've never felt so bad about it.

154

And you're sure it wasn't blue floating debris out in the water?

155

No. No. It's a day I won't forget.

156

And I remember a woman in a blue dress.

157

I can't fully explain Rachel's encounter, so Jess and I decide to secure a boat

158

and hit the water.

159

We make our way to the island where Rachel says she saw an apparition of a woman in a blue dress.

160

00:09:20,000 --> 00:09:25,000

Locals believe this lady of the lake is the manifestation of Delia Young,

161

00:09:25,000 --> 00:09:29,000

one of the first victims of the lake after it was created.

162

00:09:34,000 --> 00:09:38,000

Hi, well this is it. This is the beach where Rachel woke up.

163

00:09:38,000 --> 00:09:40,000

Yeah. I think so.

164

00:09:40,000 --> 00:09:42,000

This is the beach where Rachel woke up.

165

00:09:42,000 --> 00:09:46,000

Yeah. I definitely think something happened to her here,

166

00:09:46,000 --> 00:09:50,000

but I think we should take a look around this island and just see what we can come up with.

167

Let's go.

168

00:09:53,000 --> 00:09:55,000

Let's see.

169

00:09:55,000 --> 00:09:58,000

Okay. Thank you.

170

All right.

We investigate the island, looking for anything that could explain Rachel's sighting of the apparition in a blue dress.

172

Bill, I'm going to do an EMF sweep.

173

00:10:09,000 --> 00:10:12,000

An EMF detector measures electromagnetic fields,

174

00:10:12,000 --> 00:10:16,000

and high readings are often associated with paranormal energy.

175

00:10:18,000 --> 00:10:22,000

But EMF readings are well within normal ranges.

176

00:10:26,000 --> 00:10:29,000

Finally, we make our way back to the shoreline.

177

00:10:29,000 --> 00:10:31,000

Oh, this water's cold.

178

00:10:31,000 --> 00:10:32,000

Yeah.

179

00:10:32,000 --> 00:10:34,000

Thinking of Rachel's story.

180

00:10:34,000 --> 00:10:37,000

You're out here. It's November. It was cold out.

181

00:10:37,000 --> 00:10:39,000

The sun was probably going down.

182

00:10:39,000 --> 00:10:44,000

So I wonder if she just got so intensely cold that she actually hallucinated something.

183

00:10:44,000 --> 00:10:48,000

Training for a triathlon can be stressful on the body,

184

00:10:48,000 --> 00:10:53,000

especially in November, when the water temperature can be as low as 45 degrees.

185

00:10:53,000 --> 00:10:58,000

Cold water lowers body temperature 25 times faster than cold air.

186

00:10:58,000 --> 00:11:03,000

And hypothermia can begin after just five minutes in icy waters.

187

The veins in our extremities constrict.

188

00:11:05,000 --> 00:11:08,000

The body's attempt to keep blood flow closer to the heart.

189

00:11:08,000 --> 00:11:15,000

This reduced flow means a loss of coordination, extreme confusion, even hallucinations.

190

I mean, I suppose that's possible.

191

I hear you, but she's a trained athlete, and she lives on the lake, and she trains in the water.

192

She knows what she's getting into.

193

Yeah.

194

Rachel's strange experience on the lake is similar to countless others.

195

For decades, many have blamed the paranormal activity here

196

on the traumatic flooding of gravesites that the government was supposed to have relocated.

197

Tomorrow morning, we plan to find out the truth once and for all.

Hey, nice to meet you, Jessica.

199

Nice to meet you.

Bob.

Yeah, great to finally meet you.

Bob Kender has been a search and rescue diver in the area for more than four decades.

204

I've asked him and his team to help Phil make an extremely technical and dangerous dive.

205

The locations of the sunken graveyards in the bottom of Lake Lanier are extremely dangerous.

206

00:12:08,000 --> 00:12:10,000

The location of the sunken graveyards in the bottom of Lake Lanier

207

00:12:10,000 --> 00:12:12,000

is the most dangerous in the world.

208

00:12:12,000 --> 00:12:18,000

The location of the sunken graveyards in the bottom of Lake Lanier are now heavily silted over.

209

00:12:18,000 --> 00:12:22,000

But at nearby Lake Jocas, which was also artificially flooded,

210

00:12:22,000 --> 00:12:26,000

Bob believes we may be able to reach the location of one of the cemeteries.

211

00:12:26,000 --> 00:12:32,000

I mean, it seems like this one is the easiest access from shore and through diving.

212

00:12:32,000 --> 00:12:35,000

If you're looking for a cemetery at this location,

213

00:12:35,000 --> 00:12:41,000

our umbilicals, the surface supply gas will give us the best opportunity to get you to death.

214

00:12:41,000 --> 00:12:44,000

So we're not going to put you in fins today. We're going to have you walking.

215

00:12:44,000 --> 00:12:47,000

So what's going to happen is we're going to have you on an umbilical.

216

00:12:47,000 --> 00:12:51,000

The umbilical is going to have video, lighting, it's going to have your air supply,

217

00:12:51,000 --> 00:12:53,000

it's going to have communication.

218

00:12:53,000 --> 00:12:55,000

No, I'll be able to talk to Phil at all.

219

00:12:55,000 --> 00:12:57,000

You'll be able to talk to Phil, you'll see what Phil's seeing.

220

00:12:57,000 --> 00:13:01,000

You can guide him. He's actually going to be like a human ROV.

221

00:13:01,000 --> 00:13:04,000

You understand where we're at is right at 160 feet.

222

00:13:04,000 --> 00:13:08,000

So to get down to this potential grave site, this isn't your typical dive.

223

No, it's not your typical dive. It's outside the normal sport diving limits.

224

You know, the depths here are going to be pushing the 160 plus mark.

225

Really?

00:13:17,000 --> 00:13:18,000

Yes.

227

There's many risks to the diver.

228

The team is in Georgia investigating what is known as the most haunted lake in the world, Lake Lanier.

229

This massive body of water is home to strange accidents,

230

00:13:37,000 --> 00:13:43,000

disappearances, and even ghostly apparitions of the so-called Lady of the Lake.

231

Many believe the source of the paranormal activity are the many cemeteries in this area that were submerged.

232

For decades there had been rumors that some of the burials were not relocated.

233

To get to the bottom of this mystery, Phil is preparing to get to the bottom of the lake bed.

234

The depths here are going to be pushing the 160 plus mark.

235

Really?

236

00:14:04,000 --> 00:14:05,000

Yes.

237

00:14:05,000 --> 00:14:07,000

There's many risks to the diver.

238

We're going to have you in surface supply equipment, and we're going to protect you.

239

00:14:13,000 --> 00:14:16,000

We need to worry about, because of the depth, nitrogen and arcosis.

240

00:14:16,000 --> 00:14:17,000

What's that?

241

00:14:17,000 --> 00:14:22,000

It's rapture of the deep. It's almost like you're being drunk off the air that we breathe here on the surface.

242

00:14:22,000 --> 00:14:26,000

As someone who's spent a lot of time underwater in challenging conditions,

243

00:14:26,000 --> 00:14:30,000

it isn't an environment where you can afford to be off your A-game.

244

00:14:30,000 --> 00:14:32,000

I'm losing my grip.

245

00:14:32,000 --> 00:14:37,000

Current is terrible in here, just ripping us along the wall.

246

00:14:38,000 --> 00:14:44,000

Nitrogen and argon anesthetizes the brain, making victims feel and act disoriented.

247

00:14:44,000 --> 00:14:49,000

It has been known to cause even experienced divers to make fatal mistakes.

248

00:14:53,000 --> 00:14:56,000

So it looks like you'll be able to see everything I'm seeing.

249

00:14:56,000 --> 00:14:58,000

We can record everything I'm hearing.

250

00:14:58,000 --> 00:15:00,000

We can stay in communication.

251

00:15:00,000 --> 00:15:03,000

You know where we're trying to go, so I feel like we've got a pretty good plan here.

252

00:15:03,000 --> 00:15:06,000

I think we're set up at the exact spot you need to be.

253

00:15:06,000 --> 00:15:07,000

Okay, let's do it.

254

00:15:07,000 --> 00:15:08,000

Sounds good.

255

00:15:10,000 --> 00:15:14,000

Okay Phil, now you're going to be with Ben, but you've got to stay with him.

256

00:15:14,000 --> 00:15:16,000

We're going to be putting in commercial dive gear.

257

00:15:16,000 --> 00:15:20,000

You're making a deep dive approximately 150 feet, and you're right on the edge.

258

00:15:20,000 --> 00:15:24,000

If you go over the edge, instead of 150 feet, the next stop is 300 feet.

259

00:15:25,000 --> 00:15:27,000

So this is dangerous to dive for?

260

00:15:27,000 --> 00:15:29,000

It can be very dangerous.

261

00:15:29,000 --> 00:15:34,000

Because I'll be so heavily weighted, I'll actually be walking along a steep underwater slope

262

00:15:34,000 --> 00:15:37,000

near the edge of a perilous drop-off.

263

00:15:37,000 --> 00:15:41,000

That's why I'll be down there with the safety diver, Ben Stanfield.

264

I want to check out the Ladies of the Lake's Graves, and we're going to talk to Tommy Casper.
