unidentified flying objects in the area.

Radar operators on the USS Princeton first detect unidentified objects in low-Earth orbit.

The targets drop to 80,000 feet, arriving in groups of 10 to 20, then 28,000 feet.

That's when we know we got something. It can't identify in the sky. Like an unidentified flying

bunker also detected something no one could identify. This thing is huge. It's creepy.

it was built. On February 25th, 1942, military radar detected unidentified flying objects in

to 200 crafts swarming over coastal waters. Believing them to be attacking Japanese bombers,

troops unleashed an hour-long barrage, sending more than 1,400 shells from anti-aircraft guns

into the night sky. When the smoke cleared, no bombs had been dropped and no planes had been hit.

This incident is now known as the Battle of Los Angeles. To this day, nobody can explain what

highest-profiled UFO cases in US history. I'm wondering if we can find some clues in here

far slower than the reported speeds of the crafts

seen around Catalina.

We spoke to two eyewitnesses that experienced

The first time we saw a pilot in 2004,

453
