Last year, we ended up seeing an event occurring in the sky by the Mesa, which is just north of where we're at.

We're cutting Southwest across the 7,000 square mile Uinta basin to the MESA, where James recorded a strange UAP interaction.

MESAs, which are common in the area, are flat-topped, elevated land masses with steep sides that have been shaped over thousands of years through erosion.

The high elevation atop this MESA should serve as an excellent site for us to conduct our experiment and closely monitor the skies.

190

that may indicate they are intentional signals

191

from intelligent beings.

192

Based on this previous research and recent attempts

193

by James Keenan, we're attempting our own experiment.

194

First, we're sending a specific wavelength of laser light

195

00:11:45,000 --> 00:11:48,000

into the sky while playing a tone from our speakers

196

00:11:48,000 --> 00:11:50,000

with a matching frequency.

197

00:11:51,000 --> 00:11:53,000

Our hope is that any intelligent beings out there

198

00:11:53,000 --> 00:11:55,000

can interpret these corresponding numbers

199

00:11:55,000 --> 00:11:58,000

and respond back in a different spectrum

200

00:11:58,000 --> 00:12:00,000

in the form of radio waves.

201

00:12:02,000 --> 00:12:05,000

So what are we utilizing here with his theory?

202

So the laser that we have is 532 nanometers.

203

00:12:10,000 --> 00:12:14,000

So I'm wondering if we play 532 hertz.

204

So even if they can't quite recognize that we're intelligent,

205

00:12:17,000 --> 00:12:20,000

maybe they'll say, hey, they like this 532 number.

206

00:12:20,000 --> 00:12:21,000

Let's send it back.

207

And if they send it back, we have this.

208

00:12:24,000 --> 00:12:28,000

This is a RF receiver.

209

00:12:28,000 --> 00:12:32,000

And it will ping us and show us different little peaks here.

210

And there's a certain code that tells you a certain number.

211

00:12:35,000 --> 00:12:37,000

And so 532 is C8.

212

An RF receiver measures radio frequencies,

213

00:12:41,000 --> 00:12:45,000

a form of radiation emitted by many electronic devices.

214

00:12:45,000 --> 00:12:48,000

Everything from cell phones to satellites.

215

00:12:48,000 --> 00:12:50,000

Our hope is that any UAPs out there

216

00:12:50,000 --> 00:12:53,000

will have the same technology to send frequencies in this spectrum

217

00:12:53,000 --> 00:12:56,000

which we can then measure on this device.

218

So the goal then is to send out the 532 number,

219

both audibly and through wavelength.

220

Correct.

221

And then hopefully if there's something out there,

222

it will get that.

And then in order to say, we see you,

224

they send back a 532 signal onto the receiver.

225

Yeah, do you know how I came up with this idea?

226

I've been watching a lot of Star Trek recently.

227

And they use something like this to communicate

228

with a hyperintelligent species.

229

And it's borrowing a little bit of James's logic here

230

of just sending out something that is uniform into the air.

231

Yeah, no, I'm into it.

232

Well, while you're doing this, because this was very complicated,

233

I'm going to go ahead and just let the IR camera run.

I'm going to have eyes to the sky with the night vision goggles.

Do you want me in charge of that laser?

I'll be in charge of the laser.

Of course not.

Are all four on?

All four are on.

We're all set.

I'm going to turn on the RF receiver and see if we get anything interesting coming in.

252

Yeah, I'm not picking up any flashes.

I just saw a green flash up there.

Let me go through right in this area so you see all those little peaks.

So those are the different hits and scrolling through that tells me what we're actually receiving here.

I know how witness testimonies can change over time and I wanted to remember exactly what happened that night.
