140

what's bothering your son, whether it's paranormal or not.

What do you have?

I love PlayStation.

172

PlayStation.

173

Yeah.

174

We're setting up the video cameras.

175

I noticed Zach playing video games really close to the TV.

176

00:06:44,320 --> 00:06:46,480

And research shows that that party of brain

177

00:06:46,480 --> 00:06:48,960

stays active when you're sleeping.

178

00:06:48,960 --> 00:06:53,080

So we'll definitely factor that into our evidence analysis.

179

One thing I've noticed in our cases with children

180

00:06:55,400 --> 00:06:58,560

is that a lot of the experience are

181

00:06:58,560 --> 00:07:01,240

recounted from the kids to the parents,

182

00:07:01,240 --> 00:07:03,520

rather than the parents actually experiencing themselves.

183

00:07:03,520 --> 00:07:06,040

I wouldn't be surprised if we found Zach poke himself

184

00:07:06,040 --> 00:07:09,280

in the head or something happening, very normal,

185

00:07:09,280 --> 00:07:11,280

that he's freaking himself out.

186

00:07:11,280 --> 00:07:13,040

This is a carbon monoxide detector.

187

00:07:13,040 --> 00:07:15,160

We're going to place it in this room.

188

00:07:15,160 --> 00:07:18,000

This is the room where we have the gas hot water heater in it,

189

00:07:18,000 --> 00:07:20,560

the actual heating furnace unit itself.

190

00:07:20,560 --> 00:07:23,520

So we're going to just make sure that we don't have any leaks

191

00:07:23,520 --> 00:07:25,280

in any of that equipment.

192

00:07:25,280 --> 00:07:28,840

If it does go off alerting us to high levels of carbon

193

00:07:28,840 --> 00:07:33,240

monoxide, that the cameras pick up this red light right here.

194

00:07:33,240 --> 00:07:34,160

And I think we're all set.

195

00:07:34,160 --> 00:07:35,480

Looks good.

196

00:07:35,480 --> 00:07:38,000

OK, all of the hardlines are run.

197

00:07:38,000 --> 00:07:41,080

I think we'll be able to get going and go dark.

198

Why don't we start getting the lights out and get everything

199

00:07:46,800 --> 00:07:47,400

down?

200

00:07:47,400 --> 00:07:48,040

OK, good idea.

201

High EMF readings can be caused by a number of things.

214

Faulty equipment.

215

00:08:20,920 --> 00:08:23,120

Anything that's not shielded that's man-made

216

00:08:23,120 --> 00:08:24,800

can give off a high EMF reading.

217

00:08:24,800 --> 00:08:26,920

If there's an entity present, that can also

218

00:08:26,920 --> 00:08:29,120

give off a high EMF reading.

219

00:08:29,120 --> 00:08:31,000

If you have a consistent high EMF reading,

220

00:08:31,000 --> 00:08:33,360

then you know that it's something man-made.

221

00:08:33,360 --> 00:08:35,640

If it's not consistent, if it comes and goes,

222

00:08:35,640 --> 00:08:39,840

then chances are it's something that you can't explain.

223

What the frag?

224

00:08:40,920 --> 00:08:41,800

What?

225

00:08:41,800 --> 00:08:43,400

My head's going to explode tonight, Jay.

226
