I'm well-known, I'm influential, but you can do things I can't do in a city I was born in.

Like, you can go to better schools, you can rent or buy in a better neighborhood.

Just because of the color of your skin.

Dr Khaled now leads the new Black Panthers,

199

an underground black vigilante group advocating armed self-defense.

The rifles are with the troops.

He refused us access to the inner workings of his organisation,

but he agreed to meet me at a Harlem restaurant.
