Hey, slow down.

21

Jamie and Adam have always wanted to play at Giant Stadium, just outside New York City.

Yeah, the grand feel is great on your feet, doesn't it?

23

Yeah.

24

00:01:15,360 --> 00:01:16,360

What's meant to?

25

Selected carpeting.

26

Their game isn't football.

27

It's something far more sinister.

28

What are we here to do?

29

We're looking for Jimmy Hoffa.

30

Well, here we are in New Jersey, Giant Stadium.

31

What other myth could we be doing?

32

Has something to do with Hoffa, doesn't it?

33

Exactly.

34

This stadium is supposedly the final resting place of Union boss Jimmy Hoffa.

35

The residents know all about this story.

36

Coach, have you heard the myth about Jimmy Hoffa being buried here at Giant Stadium?

37

00:01:53,400 --> 00:01:54,400

Oh, absolutely.

38

00:01:54,400 --> 00:01:56,600

That's the first thing I heard about when I was here in 1991.

39

00:01:56,600 --> 00:01:57,600

I was an assistant coach.

40

00:01:57,600 --> 00:01:59,120

What have you heard about it?

41

00:01:59,120 --> 00:02:02,480

Well, everybody says he's buried right here on the ten yard line, probably about a foot

42

00:02:02,480 --> 00:02:04,160

behind where you stand right there.

43

00:02:04,160 --> 00:02:05,920

There used to be a hump right there.

44

00:02:05,920 --> 00:02:06,920

A hump?

45

00:02:06,920 --> 00:02:10,640

Yeah, there was even this story, and it's true, is that a player was running for a touchdown

46

00:02:10,640 --> 00:02:14,040

and tripped over the hump and fell down, and they said, that's right, tripped over

47

00:02:14,040 --> 00:02:19,120

where Hoffa was buried.

48

00:02:19,120 --> 00:02:23,040

Jimmy Hoffa was a ferocious fighter for workers' rights.

49

00:02:23,040 --> 00:02:29,480

As powerful head of the Teamsters, he was investigated over alleged mob connections and misuse of

50

00:02:29,480 --> 00:02:30,480

union funds.

51

00:02:30,480 --> 00:02:34,880

The core expenditures that I needed at that time, I can't recall offhand, and this was

52

00:02:34,880 --> 00:02:41,280

in cash also, that's right, and no collateral notes, no interest.

53

00:02:41,280 --> 00:02:45,880

Teamster boss James Hoffa surrenders to US Marshals to begin serving an eight-year prison

54

00:02:45,880 --> 00:02:46,880

term.

55

00:02:46,880 --> 00:02:53,640

In fact, he only served four years after the sentence was commuted in 1971, but in July

56

00:02:53,640 --> 00:03:00,000

1975, he disappeared without a trace from a Michigan parking lot.

57

00:03:00,000 --> 00:03:05,640

Many believe he was murdered by the mob to stop him from regaining control of the Teamsters.

58

00:03:05,640 --> 00:03:07,840

Why do people think he's here in New York, New Jersey?

59

00:03:07,840 --> 00:03:10,880

Well, there is actually a little bit of evidence to that fact.

60

00:03:10,880 --> 00:03:17,160

The FBI got a tip that he was buried in concrete here at Giant Stadium, and the stadium was

61

00:03:17,160 --> 00:03:22,680

built between 1974 and 1976, so the construction window is correct if someone had a very sick

62

00:03:22,680 --> 00:03:27,000

sense of humor that they might have buried him here.

63

00:03:27,000 --> 00:03:33,320

The best way to answer this myth is just to dig up Giant Stadium, but it's very big,

64

00:03:33,320 --> 00:03:36,240

and time is short.

65

00:03:36,240 --> 00:03:43,760

So the myth musters have another high-tech idea, and they'll test it back at the workshop.

66

They're a little out of practice.

67

00:03:54,680 --> 00:04:00,160

To replicate this myth, first up they're digging a hole in the concrete, big enough to conceal

68

00:04:00,160 --> 00:04:01,160

a body.

69

You know, something tells me today it's going to be really unpleasant.

70

Adam doesn't know it yet, but he's digging his own grave.

71

What's that?

72

00:04:14,800 --> 00:04:15,800

What?

73

00:04:15,800 --> 00:04:16,800

Nothing.

74

00:04:16,800 --> 00:04:20,640

The guys have already learned one thing.

75

It's hard work hiding a body.

76

The guys that buried Jamie Hoffa, wherever that might be, we're probably doing it in

77

the middle of the night, and they were probably a little bit more preoccupied about what they

78

00:04:33,720 --> 00:04:35,120

were doing than we are.

79

00:04:35,120 --> 00:04:37,320

Jimmy Hoffa's murderers may have had a backhoe.

80

00:04:37,320 --> 00:04:41,720

I mean, we're talking about the East Coast mob.

81

00:04:41,720 --> 00:04:49,440

Right now, Adam would kill for a backhoe.

82

00:04:49,440 --> 00:04:53,680

But things are about to get worse.

83

00:04:53,680 --> 00:04:58,400

For the next part of this test, they need a body or two.

84

The idea came from another Mythbusters misadventure involving a corvette and a deceased pig.

85

00:05:06,280 --> 00:05:08,360

Oh, God.

86

00:05:08,360 --> 00:05:10,880

This is horrifying.

87

00:05:10,880 --> 00:05:12,880

Yes, it's Porky's return.

88

00:05:12,880 --> 00:05:18,160

I can definitely smell it through the mask.

89

00:05:18,160 --> 00:05:19,440

It's pretty ranc.

90

00:05:19,440 --> 00:05:24,480

These guys died of natural causes down on the farm, but their final resting place is

91

00:05:24,480 --> 00:05:29,960

entirely unnatural.

92

00:05:29,960 --> 00:05:32,680

Man, it flies and buzzes all over them bad boys.

93

00:05:32,680 --> 00:05:34,720

You've got to feel sorry for PJ.

94

00:05:34,720 --> 00:05:37,360

He's just delivering the cement.

95

00:05:37,360 --> 00:05:38,360

Yeah.

96

00:05:38,360 --> 00:05:42,920

So PJ, specifically, have you ever heard about the fact that Jimmy Hoffa is supposedly buried

97

00:05:42,920 --> 00:05:43,920

in concrete?

98

00:05:43,920 --> 00:05:47,040

I've heard that he's buried in the 50-yard line at the metal ends.

99

00:05:47,040 --> 00:05:50,480

He disappeared so smooth and so clean.

100

00:05:50,480 --> 00:05:52,360

I don't think you'll ever find a trace of him.

101

And the fact that everybody feels that he's buried there, he's probably long gone.

102

The Mythbusters will try the same vanishing trick with the pigs.

103

Is that good?

Stop.

The smell is... it's pretty bad.

106

All right, hold on.

Okay.

What?

That stinks.

Everyone here, and everyone for five miles downwind, is hoping PJ's cement will seal

111

in that smell.

How long for this to sit?

113

Not long.

114

00:06:42,480 --> 00:06:46,680

Those gases might seep and escape while this mud is hardening up.

115

I swear I think I can smell it through the concrete.

116

Oh, hello.

117

It's smell bubbles up as if to say hello.

118

The quicker they dig in, the quicker the smell will go away, or so they hope.

119

That ought to do.

120

I want you to sign this little waiver here just in case the sidewalk explodes or whatever.

Okay.

I'm going to say, well, PJ's cleared on that.

123

Okay.

It's all in the name of science.

125

It is all in the name of science, exactly.

126

But it's more than science at stake here.

127

According to folklorist Heather Joseph Witham, the Hoffa myth is buried deep in the American

128

psyche.

129

We tell stories about Hoffa because he's this wonderful American hero, anti-hero, because

130

00:07:40,040 --> 00:07:44,320

he's the quintessential American worker, and because there's this tremendous mystery

131

00:07:44,320 --> 00:07:46,480

surrounding his death.

132

00:07:46,480 --> 00:07:49,840

And it involves the Teamsters Union.

133

00:07:49,840 --> 00:07:51,920

It involves mob bosses.

134

00:07:51,920 --> 00:07:56,800

It's a wonderfully American story.

135

00:07:56,800 --> 00:08:00,720

In essence, it's a great mystery.

136

00:08:00,720 --> 00:08:06,240

It's a mystery to the guys how that pig smell is still escaping the hard concrete two weeks

137

00:08:06,240 --> 00:08:09,240

after the burial.

138

00:08:09,240 --> 00:08:14,680

Without a doubt, we completely fail to take into account how tenacious the smell of rotting

139

00:08:14,680 --> 00:08:17,440

dead pigs can be.

140

00:08:17,440 --> 00:08:20,720

It's caught us in every way that it could catch us.

141

00:08:20,720 --> 00:08:27,200

In desperation, Jamie covers the whole stinking slab in a latex seal.

142

00:08:27,200 --> 00:08:30,640

It's a timely lesson for our trainee monsters.

143

00:08:30,640 --> 00:08:33,880

Out of sight is not always out of mind.

144

00:08:33,880 --> 00:08:40,720

If you were some kind of a nefarious person trying to do something like this, I would

145

00:08:40,720 --> 00:08:48,160

suspect that you might have a similar problem unless you were really careful.

146

00:08:48,160 --> 00:08:50,000

It's something to ponder.

147

00:08:50,000 --> 00:08:55,400

Those pigs will teach them everything they need to know before embarking on the hunt

148

00:08:55,400 --> 00:09:01,000

for Hoffa.

149

00:09:01,000 --> 00:09:02,960

It's the taxi ride from hell.

150

00:09:03,400 --> 00:09:07,800

You just wanted to go to the airport, but end up getting blown away.

151

00:09:07,800 --> 00:09:17,600

That was really cool, and that really sucked.

152

00:09:17,600 --> 00:09:21,560

The story goes that at the Rio de Janeiro airport, there is a road that runs right behind their

153

00:09:21,560 --> 00:09:23,040

main runway.

154

00:09:23,040 --> 00:09:27,440

There's a red light there that keeps you from going across that road when there's a plane

155

00:09:27,440 --> 00:09:28,440

about to take off.

156

00:09:28,440 --> 00:09:34,400

The taxi driver ran the light and found himself stuck in the jet wash of a 737 about to take

157

00:09:34,400 --> 00:09:36,440

off at full throttle.

158

00:09:36,440 --> 00:09:41,560

His taxi gets thrown up 25 meters in the air and flips over three times and falls down

159

00:09:41,560 --> 00:09:45,640

and the guys hospitalized with pretty serious injuries.

160

00:09:45,640 --> 00:09:49,880

A 737 blowing a taxi off a runway?

161

00:09:49,880 --> 00:09:52,520

That's a myth to get Jamie and Adam interested.

162

00:09:52,520 --> 00:09:54,120

It kind of makes sense.

163

00:09:54,120 --> 00:09:57,920

Those have thousands of pounds of thrust, don't they?

164

00:09:57,920 --> 00:10:02,760

Anything they do, this is what's coming up for us to test.

165

00:10:02,760 --> 00:10:08,320

So the challenge is to see if jet engines are powerful enough to roll a car.

166

00:10:08,320 --> 00:10:13,960

Big machines and wrecking stuff, the Mythbusters two favorite things.

167

00:10:13,960 --> 00:10:17,920

First things first, they need to hail a cab.

168

00:10:17,920 --> 00:10:22,960

Here you've got a cab for sale.

169

00:10:22,960 --> 00:10:29,200

Yeah we do, this is a 1999 Chrysler or Dodge Intrepid.

170

00:10:29,200 --> 00:10:35,160

Sure, the Mythbusters plan to destroy this cab, but no one wants a lemon.

171

00:10:35,160 --> 00:10:38,880

So are we driving around the lot once?

172

00:10:38,880 --> 00:10:42,960

Well, yeah, just don't leave the lot.

173

00:10:42,960 --> 00:10:43,960

Okay.

174

00:10:43,960 --> 00:10:46,440

It would be quite an elaborate way to steal a car wouldn't it?

175

00:10:46,440 --> 00:10:48,440

Bring your own camera crew?

176

00:10:48,440 --> 00:10:49,440

Yeah.

177

00:10:49,440 --> 00:10:52,680

\$900, not bad for a three-year-old car.

178

00:10:53,400 --> 00:10:56,800

What do you guys want them for?

179

00:10:56,800 --> 00:11:01,920

Well, have you ever heard the myth about the airplane that started up its jets and blew

180

00:11:01,920 --> 00:11:03,520

a taxi off the runway?

181

00:11:03,520 --> 00:11:04,520

Nope.

182

00:11:04,520 --> 00:11:06,320

Well, that's what we're going to do.

183

00:11:06,320 --> 00:11:09,480

We're going to try and get a jet to blow this thing around and see whether it actually

184

00:11:09,480 --> 00:11:10,480

works or not.

185

00:11:10,480 --> 00:11:13,600

Hey, as long as the price is right, you guys can do anything you want.

186

00:11:13,600 --> 00:11:18,920

\$900 seems a small price to pay for this level of destruction.

187

00:11:18,920 --> 00:11:23,040

I got taxi receipts for the next 10 years.

188

00:11:23,040 --> 00:11:25,120

Oh, yeah.

189

00:11:25,120 --> 00:11:31,080

Proud owners of a stylish new set of wheels, the Mythbusters now have some pretty serious

190

00:11:31,080 --> 00:11:36,040

modifications to make.

191

00:11:36,040 --> 00:11:39,840

We need to rig the car for remote control because we are going to be driving it behind

192

00:11:39,840 --> 00:11:43,600

a jet airplane as it takes off.

193

00:11:43,600 --> 00:11:48,520

What it'll do to this car is going to be pretty impressive, I believe.

194

00:11:48,520 --> 00:11:50,960

I don't want to be inside there when it happens.

195

00:11:50,960 --> 00:11:58,120

So they're creating a full-size remote-controlled taxi, but there's an annoying speed bump

196

00:11:58,120 --> 00:12:01,640

that develops on the way.

197

00:12:01,640 --> 00:12:03,280

Okay.

198

00:12:03,280 --> 00:12:06,880

Who'd have thought?

199

00:12:06,880 --> 00:12:08,720

Cheap car, dud battery.

200

00:12:08,720 --> 00:12:13,240

Well, it seems that you have to take the car tire off to change the battery.

201

00:12:13,240 --> 00:12:15,360

I mean, what is the point?

202

00:12:16,120 --> 00:12:21,080

It's probably because somebody built the damn thing in a computer and doesn't have any sense.

203

00:12:21,080 --> 00:12:22,480

Piece of crap.

204

00:12:22,480 --> 00:12:30,520

While Jamie curses all things modern, over in the art department, everything's sweetness

205

00:12:30,520 --> 00:12:31,520

and light.

206

00:12:31,520 --> 00:12:37,600

I'm making a stencil so that we can stencil our taxicab with the Mythbusters Taxi Company

207

00:12:37,600 --> 00:12:38,600

logo.

208

00:12:38,600 --> 00:12:44,920

We're going to spray this on the front of the car and on the hood and on the sides of

209

00:12:44,920 --> 00:12:45,920

the car.

210

00:12:45,920 --> 00:12:49,360

Well, I've got the old battery out now, finally.

211

00:12:49,360 --> 00:12:58,560

And the new one in, so we'll see whether this piece of shit can start.

212

00:12:58,560 --> 00:13:02,200

It lives and now to tame the beast.

213

00:13:02,200 --> 00:13:05,680

Jamie's an old hand at fitting remote controls to cars.

214

00:13:15,200 --> 00:13:18,120

In fact, he gets quite a kick out of it.

215

00:13:18,120 --> 00:13:23,800

For this job, he'll need remote control of the accelerator, brakes and steering wheel.

216

00:13:23,800 --> 00:13:28,640

There'll be three controls and I'll be able to operate this car from, I don't know, a

217

00:13:28,640 --> 00:13:30,360

couple thousand feet away or something.

218

00:13:30,360 --> 00:13:31,760

First up, the throttle.

219

00:13:31,760 --> 00:13:36,120

We simply removed the cable from the cruise control and have hooked it up to this little

220

00:13:36,120 --> 00:13:41,720

servo here with a special fitting that I make for this very purpose.

221

00:13:41,720 --> 00:13:49,200

That little motor will pull the throttle cable when Jamie gives the order.

222

00:13:49,200 --> 00:13:57,080

Jamie's got a lead thumb.

223

00:13:57,080 --> 00:13:59,720

Next up, the brakes.

224

00:13:59,720 --> 00:14:02,800

A remote control piston is welded to the pedal.

225

00:14:02,800 --> 00:14:08,120

It'll act as a kind of bionic leg.

226

00:14:08,120 --> 00:14:11,240

When you're welding, you can't really see other things that are going on around you.

227

00:14:11,760 --> 00:14:17,400

You can see the weld, okay, but not little bonfires that happen to be starting right

228

00:14:17,400 --> 00:14:20,400

all around you.

229

00:14:20,400 --> 00:14:34,280

While Jamie plays fireman, Adam is moonlighting as a sign painter.

230

00:14:34,280 --> 00:14:35,880

I love it when shit works out.

231

00:14:36,520 --> 00:14:46,240

Alright, let's put some taxi stripes on this puppy.

232

00:14:46,240 --> 00:14:50,360

I think Jamie and I should drive around and pick people up.

233

00:14:50,360 --> 00:14:59,360

With nobody in the front seat.

234

00:14:59,360 --> 00:15:02,800

Not without a remote control steering wheel they won't.

235

00:15:02,800 --> 00:15:05,800

This job is proving a little trickier than expected.

236

00:15:05,800 --> 00:15:07,720

They're going to blow the steering servo right off.

237

00:15:07,720 --> 00:15:11,680

So in the interests of safety, the airbag is coming out.

238

00:15:11,680 --> 00:15:13,360

This actually makes me kind of nervous.

239

00:15:13,360 --> 00:15:16,040

You know this is like a bomb sitting right here.

240

00:15:16,040 --> 00:15:18,040

Did someone say bomb?

241

00:15:18,040 --> 00:15:26,720

Now I think if I take these two little wires right here and hook up current to them, we

242

00:15:26,720 --> 00:15:27,720

get a boom.

243

00:15:27,720 --> 00:15:31,880

Adam and Jamie engage in some lighthearted fun.

244

00:15:31,880 --> 00:15:38,480

As usual, Buster, the long-suffering crash test dummy will bear the brunt of this harmless

245

00:15:38,480 --> 00:15:39,480

fun.

246

00:15:39,480 --> 00:15:40,480

Okay, alright.

247

00:15:40,480 --> 00:15:45,400

Now let's see if we can't get Buster to do a summer salt.

248

00:15:45,400 --> 00:15:47,200

Can I do it?

249

00:15:47,200 --> 00:15:48,200

Go ahead.

250

00:15:48,200 --> 00:15:54,200

Oh well.

251

00:15:54,960 --> 00:16:02,560

I'm thinking that I'm just going to sock this pulley right onto the two holes that are centered

252

00:16:02,560 --> 00:16:04,240

on this steering wheel.

253

00:16:04,240 --> 00:16:09,520

When I'm done, this will stay rigid and the steering wheel will turn like so.

254

00:16:09,520 --> 00:16:11,720

Nothing to it really.

255

00:16:11,720 --> 00:16:16,840

Seems like it's working.

256

00:16:16,840 --> 00:16:19,200

Another Heinemann triumph.

257

00:16:19,200 --> 00:16:22,680

Sometimes he makes things look a little too easy.

258

00:16:22,680 --> 00:16:24,400

Buster's got another bone to pick.

259

00:16:24,400 --> 00:16:28,400

There's a reason I wear black so I can get really dirty and it's hard to tell.

260

00:16:28,400 --> 00:16:30,440

Jamie is wearing a white shirt.

261

00:16:30,440 --> 00:16:35,400

His hands look like he's a coal miner and I'm having trouble spotting a stain on the

262

00:16:35,400 --> 00:16:37,400

damn shirt.

263

00:16:37,400 --> 00:16:41,520

You know, it just makes me want to shake his hand and then slap it on his chest.

264

00:16:41,520 --> 00:16:47,960

So they finished their magic taxi and now it's time to take it on a road trip to destruction.

265

00:16:47,960 --> 00:16:52,560

Of course, no adventure is complete without the forgotten Miss Buster.

266

00:16:52,600 --> 00:16:55,160

Buster's got to get dressed and get in the cab so we can go.

267

00:16:55,160 --> 00:16:59,000

We're all waiting on Buster.

268

00:16:59,000 --> 00:17:00,000

He's not luggage.

269

00:17:00,000 --> 00:17:01,720

He's the star of the show.

270

00:17:01,720 --> 00:17:06,680

Okay, well then that means that every time we move the car, we have to move Buster.

271

00:17:06,680 --> 00:17:07,680

No, no, no.

272

00:17:07,680 --> 00:17:09,040

He doesn't go and he can go in the passenger seat.

273

00:17:09,040 --> 00:17:10,040

That's all.

274

Everyone knows this trip will end badly for the taxi and probably Buster too.

281

But undeterred, the Myth Busters ride on in search of a 737 jet willing to blow their

282

00:17:40,320 --> 00:17:48,560

car off the road.

283

00:17:48,560 --> 00:17:53,800

John in the Mojave Desert and the Myth Busters are on a mission.

284

00:17:53,800 --> 00:17:58,960

This is where America's airplanes come to die or at least rest for a while.

285

00:17:58,960 --> 00:18:04,160

We're here at the Mojave Desert Airport at a storage facility where they keep jet airplanes

286

00:18:04,160 --> 00:18:06,120

when they're not in service.

287

00:18:06,120 --> 00:18:11,800

Even though it's six in the morning and I am not the greatest morning person alive,

288

00:18:11,800 --> 00:18:16,720

I'm in an airport salvage yard with huge husks of planes around me.

289

00:18:16,720 --> 00:18:17,880

I'm in pig heaven.

290

00:18:17,880 --> 00:18:23,960

They've come to this junkyard nirvana to test the jet taxi myth which claims the jet

291

00:18:23,960 --> 00:18:30,400

blast from a 737 on a Brazilian runway blew a taxi right off the road.

292

00:18:30,400 --> 00:18:36,120

To the Myth Busters, this seems a disaster worth recreating.

293

00:18:36,120 --> 00:18:43,040

So they've converted their very own taxi to remote control.

294

00:18:43,040 --> 00:18:52,560

I've had nights like that.

295

00:18:52,560 --> 00:18:54,560

It's not that maneuverable but we don't need it to be.

296

00:18:54,560 --> 00:18:58,040

We just need to get it out and into the jet wash and we're golden.

297

00:18:58,040 --> 00:19:01,240

Now there are two vital ingredients to this myth.

298

00:19:01,240 --> 00:19:07,000

The taxi, which they have, and a jet, which they don't, yet.

299

00:19:07,000 --> 00:19:11,160

But they have arranged for one to be waiting just across the airfield.

300

00:19:11,440 --> 00:19:12,920

Jamie is getting excited.

301

00:19:12,920 --> 00:19:17,440

I guess the biggest excitement is that we really don't know for sure what it's going

302

00:19:17,440 --> 00:19:18,440

to do.

303

00:19:18,440 --> 00:19:21,840

Those jets have an awful lot of power so you've got to think that it's just going to pick

304

00:19:21,840 --> 00:19:23,200

this cab up and throw it.

305

00:19:23,200 --> 00:19:29,200

I think this taxi is just going to turn into like a leaf in that kind of blast.

306

00:19:29,200 --> 00:19:33,360

Now it's hard to miss a 737 in an open field.

307

00:19:33,360 --> 00:19:35,400

But here's a worry.

308

00:19:35,400 --> 00:19:39,680

Theirs is conspicuously and disturbingly absent.

309

00:19:39,680 --> 00:19:40,680

Hello.

310

00:19:40,680 --> 00:19:41,680

Yep.

311

00:19:41,680 --> 00:19:42,680

Yep.

312

00:19:42,680 --> 00:19:43,680

Okay.

313

00:19:43,680 --> 00:19:44,680

All right.

314

00:19:44,680 --> 00:19:45,680

Yep.

315

00:19:45,680 --> 00:19:56,880

The insurance company has decided the stunt could damage the aircraft and pulled the plug.

316

The whole reason this is an issue is because we can't control, we don't know what the jet

317

00:20:01,720 --> 00:20:02,960

will do to the taxi.

318

00:20:02,960 --> 00:20:07,000

But there's no way in hell that taxi is going to do anything but go farther away from the

319

00:20:07,000 --> 00:20:08,680

jet.

320

00:20:08,680 --> 00:20:14,040

There will be no plane on the ground and there is certainly no love in the air.

321

00:20:14,040 --> 00:20:17,680

We got a yes yesterday and a no today.

322

00:20:17,680 --> 00:20:21,640

It's just like, ugh, it's driving me crazy.

323

00:20:21,640 --> 00:20:24,840

Here it comes.

324

00:20:24,840 --> 00:20:25,840

That's our plane, man.

325

00:20:25,840 --> 00:20:26,840

That was our destiny.

326

00:20:26,840 --> 00:20:27,840

Aw.

327

00:20:27,840 --> 00:20:30,840

That would have flipped our taxi.

328

00:20:31,840 --> 00:20:35,960

I want to see a taxi flip.

329

00:20:35,960 --> 00:20:42,560

You know, we came all the way down here where they've got a plethora, a conjury of planes

330

00:20:42,560 --> 00:20:45,720

and you know, we can't get one started up.

331

00:20:45,720 --> 00:20:50,400

And there's so many bazillion different reasons why we can't get one started up.

332

00:20:50,400 --> 00:20:56,440

It would boggle your mind if I explained even five of them.

333

00:20:56,560 --> 00:21:01,360

The show must go on and the mythbusters are moving to Plan B.

334

00:21:01,360 --> 00:21:07,760

Plan B, I believe, involves a separate engine without an airplane that we can hire to be

335

00:21:07,760 --> 00:21:10,880

brought to where our car is and that'll do the job.

336

00:21:10,880 --> 00:21:15,760

They're going to bring in two jet engines to be operated off stands.

337

00:21:15,760 --> 00:21:20,800

It won't make Adam feel better, but the fact he found this story on the internet really

338

00:21:20,800 --> 00:21:22,600

doesn't mean it actually happened.

339

00:21:22,600 --> 00:21:28,360

I can't tell anymore whether a newspaper story online is true or false.

340

00:21:28,360 --> 00:21:34,280

It's really just impossible because a lot of the internet legends appear as news items

341

00:21:34,280 --> 00:21:38,360

and newspapers often pick up urban legends and repeat them as news.

342

00:21:46,360 --> 00:21:51,840

Early the next morning, the mythbusters' new, grounded engines arrive.

343

00:21:51,840 --> 00:21:56,040

They're normally used to generate wind for movie special effects.

344

00:21:56,040 --> 00:22:00,960

These engines are turbojet engines and they're at the nozzle, at the tailpipe nozzle, we

345

00:22:00,960 --> 00:22:05,120

have about 400 miles an hour as far as I could measure.

346

00:22:05,120 --> 00:22:07,920

Do you think we'll be successful today in flipping our taxi over?

347

00:22:07,920 --> 00:22:08,920

It's a difficult project.

348

00:22:08,920 --> 00:22:09,920

I have no idea.

349

00:22:09,920 --> 00:22:11,880

It'd be interesting.

350

00:22:11,880 --> 00:22:18,480

The plan is to fire up the jet engines, then drive the taxi past at a range of 20 feet.

351

00:22:18,480 --> 00:22:21,400

That's where the combined blast should be the strongest.

352

00:22:21,400 --> 00:22:25,920

I wouldn't really want to be in the car when it goes by them, but I'm not so sure that

353

00:22:25,920 --> 00:22:27,680

it's going to be that dramatic.

354

00:22:27,680 --> 00:22:32,560

I think the whole thing is just going to go and roll over three or four times.

355

00:22:32,560 --> 00:22:34,480

I think Jamie's being a little pessimistic.

356

00:22:34,480 --> 00:22:37,480

There we go.

357

00:22:37,480 --> 00:22:38,480

That's a good one.

358

00:22:38,480 --> 00:22:39,480

All right, Buster.

359

You ready to fly?

Now like the myth, the cab will take its chances running the gauntlet through the jet wash.

365

00:23:15,120 --> 00:23:25,200

It was a rough ride, but the cab didn't look like it was being flipped.

366

00:23:25,200 --> 00:23:26,960

It affected the car.

367

00:23:26,960 --> 00:23:30,080

It made it wiggle a little bit.

368

00:23:30,080 --> 00:23:33,120

Whoa, it took the casket out of the door.

369

I got to say I was a little disappointed, and not only because Jamie was right and I

370

00:23:38,800 --> 00:23:39,800

was wrong.

371

What we'll do this time is just park the car in the absolute optimal spot for the

372

00:23:44,920 --> 00:23:51,400

jets to hit them, and we'll let those guys aim them correctly, and we'll see what happens.

373

The jet engines are moved in closer to each other and closer to the car.

374

00:23:56,920 --> 00:23:57,920

Ready to go?

375

00:23:57,920 --> 00:23:58,920

Ready to go.

376

00:23:58,920 --> 00:23:59,920

All right.

377

00:23:59,920 --> 00:24:00,920

Let's get everyone going.

378

00:24:00,920 --> 00:24:01,920

Attention, everybody.

379

00:24:01,920 --> 00:24:02,920

We are ready to go.

380

00:24:02,920 --> 00:24:28,920

If the near side rises just enough, the blast will bounce under the car and flip it.

381

00:24:28,920 --> 00:24:42,360

They have to abort early.

382

00:24:42,360 --> 00:24:49,240

This is a working airport, and debris is flying all over the runway.

383

00:24:49,240 --> 00:24:57,040

First the taxi sign, then the front fender.

384

00:24:57,040 --> 00:25:11,000

The back fender, and the mirrors were taking off next.

385

00:25:11,000 --> 00:25:13,120

And here's an unexpected development.

386

00:25:13,120 --> 00:25:16,400

That's a hot car.

387

00:25:16,400 --> 00:25:18,120

Yeah, it was smoking.

388

00:25:18,120 --> 00:25:22,880

The blast from the jet engines has heated the car up.

389

00:25:22,880 --> 00:25:26,560

There's every possibility that we could set the car on fire.

390

00:25:27,320 --> 00:25:30,960

Got it really hot, and the whole car was starting to smoke.

391

00:25:30,960 --> 00:25:34,040

In fact, that was more likely than they realized.

392

00:25:34,040 --> 00:25:37,080

The fuel lines have been torn out too.

393

Adam does not want to play with fire.

394

00:25:40,680 --> 00:25:41,680

That looks like gas.

395

00:25:41,680 --> 00:25:42,680

It's fueling, guys.

396

00:25:42,680 --> 00:25:43,680

Jamie?

00:25:43,680 --> 00:25:44,680

Yeah?

398

00:25:44,680 --> 00:25:47,520

We should get this off the runway.

399

I'm disinclined to proceed when we've got a leaking fuel tank, and we're pointing flaming

400

00:25:52,320 --> 00:25:56,160

jets at this car, but we're going to try and siphon it out.

401

00:25:56,160 --> 00:26:00,840

While the tank is being emptied, the jet engines are being moved to a safer position

402

00:26:00,840 --> 00:26:05,800

for one last try.

403

00:26:05,800 --> 00:26:06,800

Nicely done, Jamie.

404

00:26:06,800 --> 00:26:07,800

Is that good?

405

00:26:07,800 --> 00:26:10,160

Keep going, keep going.

406

00:26:10,160 --> 00:26:16,320

And a few modifications are made to help the taxi on its way.

407

00:26:16,320 --> 00:26:17,840

We're just trying to get this car to flip.

408

00:26:17,840 --> 00:26:19,040

We know it can flip.

409

00:26:19,040 --> 00:26:21,040

We're just trying to help it along.

410

00:26:21,040 --> 00:26:22,480

We've let the tires out on one side.

411

00:26:22,480 --> 00:26:24,600

We put them on a little bit of a slope.

412

00:26:24,600 --> 00:26:31,400

We are jacking up the side that faces the wind, and we should get a rolling cab.

413

00:26:31,400 --> 00:26:36,360

If this doesn't work, it's safe to say it never will with these engines.

414

00:26:36,360 --> 00:26:39,920

The meter is running, and time is nearly up for this myth.

415

00:26:54,600 --> 00:27:02,600

It's official.

416

00:27:02,600 --> 00:27:08,480

The flip is a flop.

417

00:27:08,480 --> 00:27:11,200

I think this is a first for us.

418

00:27:11,200 --> 00:27:12,640

It's a myth buster's failure.

419

00:27:12,640 --> 00:27:17,040

It's unable through reasons of technology and, well...

420

00:27:17,040 --> 00:27:18,040

Insurance.

421

00:27:18,040 --> 00:27:20,640

Insurance brokers to make it happen.

422

00:27:20,640 --> 00:27:21,640

What do we say here?

423

00:27:21,640 --> 00:27:23,840

Do we say that the myth busters are busted?

424

00:27:24,600 --> 00:27:32,560

Well, you know, we just couldn't afford the right jet, is what it amounts to.

425

00:27:32,560 --> 00:27:38,120

Let's call that a day.

426

00:27:38,120 --> 00:27:40,360

But it's not quite a day.

427

00:27:40,360 --> 00:27:42,640

Turns out this one really is true.

428

00:27:42,640 --> 00:27:48,600

In January 2002, Rio de Janeiro TV News captured the aftermath.

429

A taxi did indeed drive along an airport access road at the wrong time, and a revved-up 737

430

00:27:57,440 --> 00:28:02,680

blew the car 75 feet, injuring the driver.

431

00:28:02,680 --> 00:28:06,040

And the myth busters thought they had a bad day.

432

00:28:06,040 --> 00:28:22,440

It's been several months since Jamie and Adam buried two pigs in concrete outside their

433

00:28:22,440 --> 00:28:23,440

workshop.

434

00:28:23,440 --> 00:28:28,880

They're hoping it will help them bust the myth Jimmy Hoffa is buried at Giant Stadium.

435

00:28:28,880 --> 00:28:30,920

Hi, Dick, Adam Savage.

436

00:28:30,920 --> 00:28:36,160

They've enlisted the help of Dick Sylvester, who's skilled in the use of ground penetrating

437

00:28:36,160 --> 00:28:37,160

radar.

438

00:28:37,160 --> 00:28:41,560

Dick, can you walk us through exactly how ground penetrating radar actually works?

439

00:28:41,560 --> 00:28:42,560

Certainly.

440

00:28:42,560 --> 00:28:46,760

The antenna right here is a little radio transmitter and receiver.

441

00:28:46,760 --> 00:28:52,800

And so pulses are sent to the antenna, and these radio transmit pulses go into the ground.

442

00:28:52,800 --> 00:28:56,800

And where there's a change in soil properties, or there's an object on the ground, then the

443

00:28:56,800 --> 00:29:00,800

reflections return and are printed on the graphic recorder we've been looking at.

444

00:29:00,800 --> 00:29:02,800

Can you just drag it?

445

00:29:02,800 --> 00:29:03,800

Is that it?

446

00:29:03,800 --> 00:29:07,520

So this orange box transmits a signal down into the ground.

447

00:29:07,520 --> 00:29:13,480

If there's a body, or a cavity where a body used to be, it should show up on this screen.

448

00:29:13,480 --> 00:29:14,480

This is what this is showing you.

449

00:29:14,480 --> 00:29:17,480

The ground surface is here, and these are features underneath the ground surface.

450

00:29:17,480 --> 00:29:20,720

Dick, have you ever used your ground penetrating radar to look for bodies?

451

00:29:20,720 --> 00:29:22,640

Yes, as a matter of fact.

452

00:29:22,760 --> 00:29:28,440

In Alaska, where they wanted to move some varial grounds of natives, we used the radar

453

00:29:28,440 --> 00:29:32,920

system up there to map the bodies, and then they excavated them and moved them.

454

00:29:32,920 --> 00:29:38,360

But how will this fancy piece of equipment perform through solid concrete?

455

00:29:38,360 --> 00:29:40,400

Will porcupine show up?

456

00:29:40,400 --> 00:29:41,400

Yeah.

457

00:29:41,400 --> 00:29:42,400

Go.

458

00:29:42,400 --> 00:29:47,320

Jamie has to make a series of passes over the area.

459

00:29:48,320 --> 00:29:53,000

If I saw this, that would tell me that that's rebar in the concrete.

460

00:29:53,000 --> 00:29:55,560

In fact, there are four lengths of rebar.

461

00:29:55,560 --> 00:29:58,160

You can't hide that from me.

462

00:29:58,160 --> 00:30:00,160

All right, good, good.

463

00:30:00,160 --> 00:30:02,040

Yeah, we forgot about that.

464

00:30:02,040 --> 00:30:08,120

Another crossing, another reading, and sure enough, clear signs of the secret lurking

465

00:30:08,120 --> 00:30:09,120

beneath.

466

00:30:09,120 --> 00:30:10,120

That's correct.

467

00:30:10,120 --> 00:30:14,160

What I'm seeing is here's a rebar, and then I'm seeing this is very particular to the

468

00:30:14,160 --> 00:30:16,440

area it looks like.

469

00:30:16,440 --> 00:30:20,000

This feature, which I don't see below, and I don't see above, and I don't see on either

470

00:30:20,000 --> 00:30:21,720

side, which leads me to believe.

471

00:30:21,720 --> 00:30:25,680

So the white pattern here is a change in reflectivity characteristics.

472

00:30:25,680 --> 00:30:29,720

So it says you have some object there that's different than the dirt that you would be

473

00:30:29,720 --> 00:30:30,960

looking at on either side.

474

00:30:30,960 --> 00:30:31,960

Exactly.

475

00:30:31,960 --> 00:30:36,480

In the psychedelic readout of the monitor, it's hard to picture exactly what's going

476

00:30:36,480 --> 00:30:38,160

on down there.

477

00:30:38,160 --> 00:30:43,000

There's really only one way to find out, and it will not be pretty.

478

00:30:43,000 --> 00:30:46,640

We've got some pigs that have been in the ground for five months.

479

00:30:46,640 --> 00:30:51,840

We've seen what kind of profile they draw on the ground penetrating radar, and in our

480

00:30:51,840 --> 00:30:56,360

preparation to search for Jimmy Hoffa, the last step is to crack open the sidewalk and

481

00:30:56,360 --> 00:31:04,320

see what they look like down there.

482

00:31:04,320 --> 00:31:10,480

It's possible Egyptian archaeologists experienced similar emotions as they were about to open

483

00:31:10,480 --> 00:31:12,840

a tomb for the first time.

484

00:31:13,680 --> 00:31:15,680

It's possible, but unlikely.

485

00:31:15,680 --> 00:31:18,840

Check that out.

486

00:31:18,840 --> 00:31:22,840

The crack the seal man, look, it's like an open void in there.

487

00:31:22,840 --> 00:31:28,840

I got to tell you, I don't miss that smell.

488

00:31:28,840 --> 00:31:33,840

Two, three, two.

489

00:31:33,840 --> 00:31:35,840

Ah.

490

00:31:43,840 --> 00:31:49,840

You know, Adam, I was kind of looking forward to this, but that first strong whiff, it's

491

00:31:49,840 --> 00:31:53,840

just, it's not fun doing this.

492

It's just plain wrong.

493

00:31:54,840 --> 00:31:56,840

Wow, can you see that?

494

00:31:56,840 --> 00:31:59,840

Can you see I see a pig, aw man, a pig-shaped armhole.

495

Aw man.

496

You know, I'm thinking maybe we take the night shot camera and put it down there instead

497

of going down there ourselves.

Oh.

500

00:32:11,840 --> 00:32:13,840

Let's get this cleared out.

Irresistible curiosity is a cruel master.

It's got the better of the mythbusters again.

503

Just a tiny bit.

I think we have determined one main thing that we wanted to know, which was that a decomposing

515

We've shown that.

They've learned what happens to a body buried in concrete and how to find it with a radar.

The mythbusters are ready to begin the search for Hoffa.

525

It's a myth to sink your fangs into.

526

00:33:25,840 --> 00:33:28,840

Arachnophobics need not apply.

527

Oh, this is terrible.

528

00:33:30,840 --> 00:33:39,840

Is the Daddy Long Legs really a deadly killer?

529

00:33:39,840 --> 00:33:40,840

All right, big guy.

530

00:33:40,840 --> 00:33:41,840

What is the myth?

531

00:33:41,840 --> 00:33:42,840

What do we got now?

532

00:33:42,840 --> 00:33:46,840

The myth is that the Daddy Long Legs spider is actually the most toxic spider in the world.

533

00:33:46,840 --> 00:33:52,840

But the problem is that their fangs are so short that they can't penetrate human skin.

534

00:33:52,840 --> 00:33:56,840

If it's true, this would surely be nature's cruelest trick.

535

Venom to kill an ox.

Fangs to kill a gnat.

537

But imagine all that poison hanging around our holes.

Jamie, I'm curious why your house turned out to be spider heaven.

559

I like spiders.

560

We have them as pets.

561

00:35:16,840 --> 00:35:17,840

It was about that big.

562

00:35:17,840 --> 00:35:18,840

Boom.

563

00:35:18,840 --> 00:35:20,840

Yeah, it was as big as a dinner plate.

564

00:35:20,840 --> 00:35:22,840

We fed it mice.

565

00:35:23,840 --> 00:35:26,840

They've wrangled about 40 spiders.

566

00:35:26,840 --> 00:35:27,840

Got it.

567

00:35:27,840 --> 00:35:29,840

All right.

568

00:35:29,840 --> 00:35:31,840

There we go.

569

00:35:31,840 --> 00:35:37,840

Now to test this myth, they have to extract some venom.

570

They also have to find out how toxic it is.

571

They'll measure the spider's fangs to see if they're long enough to pierce skin

572

00:35:47,840 --> 00:35:53,840

and last, as a conclusive test, enter the tube of death.

573

But that's later.

574

00:35:56,840 --> 00:36:00,840

First, the mythbusters need an expert spider milker.

575

00:36:00,840 --> 00:36:04,840

They've lured our acknowledges Chuck Christensen into their web.

576

00:36:04,840 --> 00:36:07,840

How do you get venom out of something this small?

577

00:36:07,840 --> 00:36:10,840

Well, actually, if you make your tools small enough

578

00:36:10,840 --> 00:36:14,840

and you use enough magnification, it looks quite large.

579

00:36:14,840 --> 00:36:18,840

I'm hooking up a spider milking pump.

580

00:36:18,840 --> 00:36:22,840

First, to stop the spider's struggling and hurting itself,

581

00:36:22,840 --> 00:36:25,840

it has to be put into a shallow sleep.

582

00:36:25,840 --> 00:36:27,840

How do we anesthetize a spider?

583

00:36:27,840 --> 00:36:29,840

Okay, we use carbon dioxide gas.

584

00:36:29,840 --> 00:36:31,840

They go to sleep or they die?

585

00:36:31,840 --> 00:36:33,840

They go to sleep and they'll come back.

586

00:36:33,840 --> 00:36:34,840

They should be fine.

587

00:36:34,840 --> 00:36:39,840

The sleeping spider is carefully positioned on a special clamp.

588

00:36:39,840 --> 00:36:41,840

So take the spider in, we'll put it,

589

00:36:41,840 --> 00:36:45,840

position it with the fangs on the opposite side of this.

590

00:36:45,840 --> 00:36:47,840

What we need to draw the venom out of the spider

591

00:36:47,840 --> 00:36:51,840

is like the longest, thinnest hollow tube you can possibly imagine.

592

00:36:51,840 --> 00:36:57,840

It makes your average, like, insulin syringe look like a 10-penny nail.

593

00:36:57,840 --> 00:37:01,840

That's made by heating and stretching out the tiniest glass pipette

594

00:37:01,840 --> 00:37:06,840

until it's hair thin.

595

00:37:06,840 --> 00:37:10,840

Under a microscope, the tube is positioned near the fangs,

596

00:37:10,840 --> 00:37:13,840

then a really clever trick.

597

00:37:13,840 --> 00:37:16,840

A tiny electric shock is delivered through the clamp,

598

00:37:16,840 --> 00:37:19,840

which induces the spider to produce venom.

599

00:37:19,840 --> 00:37:21,840

Okay, there's a little bit of venom coming out.

600

00:37:21,840 --> 00:37:22,840

Oh, I see it.

601

00:37:22,840 --> 00:37:23,840

There it is.

602

00:37:23,840 --> 00:37:25,840

Look at that.

603

00:37:25,840 --> 00:37:27,840

That's excellent.

604

00:37:27,840 --> 00:37:29,840

Okay, that's the venom we got right there.

605

00:37:29,840 --> 00:37:31,840

Excellent.

606

00:37:31,840 --> 00:37:34,840

So that's just a few nanoleaders of venom,

607

00:37:34,840 --> 00:37:36,840

a few billionths of a liter of venom.

608

00:37:36,840 --> 00:37:38,840

Science in action.

609

00:37:40,840 --> 00:37:43,840

A few billionths of a liter of venom.

610

00:37:43,840 --> 00:37:46,840

It's a shame they're not doing this experiment

611

00:37:46,840 --> 00:37:48,840

with the Australian funnel web.

612

00:37:48,840 --> 00:37:50,840

They're cranky little guys,

613

00:37:50,840 --> 00:37:55,840

and by comparison, their fangs are venom fire hoses.

614

00:37:55,840 --> 00:37:58,840

It would take an awfully long time

615

00:37:58,840 --> 00:38:00,840

to get enough Daddy Long Legs venom

616

00:38:00,840 --> 00:38:02,840

to carry out a meaningful test.

617

00:38:02,840 --> 00:38:07,840

For one drop, we need about maybe 100, 200, 500 spiders,

618

00:38:07,840 --> 00:38:09,840

just for one drop of venom.

619

00:38:09,840 --> 00:38:12,840

A really good spider milker

620

00:38:12,840 --> 00:38:14,840

can work through 100 spiders an hour.

621

00:38:14,840 --> 00:38:19,840

It's a challenge no self-respecting myth buster could pass up.

622

00:38:19,840 --> 00:38:21,840

So I take a sleepy spider.

623

00:38:21,840 --> 00:38:23,840

Can you see the fangs there?

624

00:38:23,840 --> 00:38:24,840

I can.

625

00:38:24,840 --> 00:38:26,840

Uh, uh, okay.

626

00:38:26,840 --> 00:38:28,840

Oop, oop, yeah.

627

00:38:28,840 --> 00:38:30,840

It's really hard working this small.

628

00:38:30,840 --> 00:38:32,840

You have to have a very steady hand.

629

00:38:33,840 --> 00:38:35,840

That's it.

630

00:38:35,840 --> 00:38:38,840

Oh, that's hard work.

631

00:38:38,840 --> 00:38:41,840

So there may be venom in there, there may not.

632

00:38:41,840 --> 00:38:45,840

As spider milkers, the myth busters make good TV hosts.

633

00:38:45,840 --> 00:38:48,840

But how toxic is this venom?

634

00:38:50,840 --> 00:38:53,840

Chuck's research can help with that too.

635

00:38:53,840 --> 00:38:55,840

Under strictly controlled conditions,

636

00:38:55,840 --> 00:38:57,840

with a vet present,

637

00:38:57,840 --> 00:39:00,840

this compared the impact of Daddy Long Legs venom

638

00:39:00,840 --> 00:39:03,840

and Black Widow venom on mice.

639

00:39:03,840 --> 00:39:05,840

The results were clear.

640

00:39:05,840 --> 00:39:08,840

With the Black Widow, we had a much stronger reaction.

641

00:39:08,840 --> 00:39:10,840

It was the same amount of venom,

642

00:39:10,840 --> 00:39:14,840

so clearly the Black Widow venom is much more potent.

643

00:39:14,840 --> 00:39:16,840

So we've already busted one part of the myth,

644

00:39:16,840 --> 00:39:19,840

at least, in that the Daddy Long Legs venom

645

00:39:19,840 --> 00:39:21,840

is not the most toxic in the world.

646

00:39:21,840 --> 00:39:23,840

The Black Widow venom is clearly more toxic.

647

00:39:23,840 --> 00:39:25,840

Exactly.

648

00:39:25,840 --> 00:39:27,840

The Black Widow is generally regarded

649

00:39:27,840 --> 00:39:30,840

as the most poisonous spider in North America.

650

00:39:32,840 --> 00:39:34,840

On the world stage,

651

00:39:34,840 --> 00:39:37,840

the Brazilian wandering spider takes the points

652

00:39:37,840 --> 00:39:39,840

ahead of the funnel web.

653

00:39:39,840 --> 00:39:41,840

But that doesn't mean the guys are finished

654

00:39:41,840 --> 00:39:43,840

with the Daddy Long Legs myth.

655

00:39:43,840 --> 00:39:45,840

Well, I guess the only other thing now

656

00:39:45,840 --> 00:39:47,840

is to find out if the Daddy Long Legs

657

00:39:47,840 --> 00:39:49,840

can actually bite a human.

658

00:39:49,840 --> 00:39:51,840

That would mean if the fangs are long enough

659

00:39:51,840 --> 00:39:54,840

and if they're powerful enough to stick it through human skin.

660

00:39:55,840 --> 00:39:58,840

Our skin can be as thin as a tenth of a millimeter.

661

00:39:58,840 --> 00:40:00,840

There's a fang right there.

662

00:40:00,840 --> 00:40:02,840

All those are so tiny.

663

00:40:02,840 --> 00:40:04,840

Under the microscope,

664

00:40:04,840 --> 00:40:07,840

it's clear the fangs, though small, are longer than that.

665

00:40:07,840 --> 00:40:09,840

That's a quarter of a millimeter.

666

00:40:09,840 --> 00:40:11,840

That's more than long enough to break through

667

00:40:11,840 --> 00:40:13,840

the dead layer of skin on an average person.

668

00:40:13,840 --> 00:40:15,840

A bunch of green links.

669

00:40:15,840 --> 00:40:17,840

Which leaves just one test left.

670

00:40:17,840 --> 00:40:20,840

A test of nerve in the tube of death.

671

00:40:21,840 --> 00:40:23,840

For arachnophobic Adam,

672

00:40:23,840 --> 00:40:25,840

it's his biggest nightmare.

673

00:40:25,840 --> 00:40:29,840

But urban legend is full of spider horror stories.

674

00:40:29,840 --> 00:40:32,840

There's a spider's nest in the woman's beehive,

675

00:40:32,840 --> 00:40:35,840

which was the fashionable hairdo of the day.

676

00:40:35,840 --> 00:40:38,840

And then the eggs hatch and kill the woman.

677

00:40:38,840 --> 00:40:41,840

Or you have someone who gets bitten on the face

678

00:40:41,840 --> 00:40:44,840

by a spider, but they think it's a mosquito bite or a pimple.

679

00:40:44,840 --> 00:40:46,840

And instead it fills up and gets bigger and bigger,

680

00:40:46,840 --> 00:40:48,840

and then it just bursts and all these little spiders

681

00:40:48,840 --> 00:40:51,840

go crying all over her face and she dies.

682

00:40:51,840 --> 00:40:54,840

Adam's coming clean.

683

00:40:54,840 --> 00:40:56,840

You should perhaps mention at this point

684

00:40:56,840 --> 00:40:59,840

that I do suffer from a small amount of spider phobia,

685

00:40:59,840 --> 00:41:02,840

otherwise known as arachnophobia.

686

00:41:07,840 --> 00:41:09,840

If he was hoping for sympathy,

687

00:41:09,840 --> 00:41:11,840

he's sorely let down.

688

00:41:11,840 --> 00:41:13,840

Oh, that's funky.

689

00:41:13,840 --> 00:41:16,840

Oh, I don't like this at all.

690

00:41:16,840 --> 00:41:19,840

This is really awful.

691

00:41:19,840 --> 00:41:23,840

The idea is to encourage the spiders to bite.

692

00:41:23,840 --> 00:41:28,840

If Adam survives, it's the ultimate myth busted.

693

00:41:28,840 --> 00:41:30,840

It's like your worst nightmare,

694

00:41:30,840 --> 00:41:33,840

but when you're sticking your head in something...

695

00:41:33,840 --> 00:41:35,840

Ah!

696

00:41:41,840 --> 00:41:43,840

This is terrible.

697

00:41:43,840 --> 00:41:46,840

All their information says he's perfectly safe,

698

00:41:46,840 --> 00:41:50,840

but right now, rational thought isn't coming easily.

699

00:41:50,840 --> 00:41:52,840

We haven't seen any evidence at all

700

00:41:52,840 --> 00:41:55,840

of lethal, daddy-long-leg spiders.

701

00:41:55,840 --> 00:41:57,840

Not yet.

702

00:42:01,840 --> 00:42:03,840

Can I take my arm out of here?

703

00:42:03,840 --> 00:42:05,840

No way, man.

704

00:42:06,840 --> 00:42:11,840

The only way Adam's getting out is with bite marks.

705

00:42:11,840 --> 00:42:15,840

And, at last, a spider seems willing to oblige.

706

00:42:18,840 --> 00:42:20,840

Yeah, I think I just got bitten right here.

707

00:42:20,840 --> 00:42:22,840

You got bit?

708

00:42:22,840 --> 00:42:25,840

Yeah, I felt a little bit of like a tiny little burning.

709

00:42:25,840 --> 00:42:27,840

He landed right on my index finger,

710

00:42:27,840 --> 00:42:29,840

and I felt a little tiny burning.

711

00:42:29,840 --> 00:42:31,840

I looked and he was down, and he came up and he walked away,

712

00:42:31,840 --> 00:42:33,840

and now it's like, it's already gone.

713

00:42:33,840 --> 00:42:35,840

Yeah, exactly. That's it.

714

00:42:35,840 --> 00:42:37,840

Well, that's not that toxic.

715

00:42:37,840 --> 00:42:39,840

Hell, it isn't so bad.

716

00:42:40,840 --> 00:42:43,840

Adam survived his worst nightmare.

717

00:42:43,840 --> 00:42:45,840

He's feeling braver already.

718

00:42:45,840 --> 00:42:50,840

Even better, they've comprehensively busted the daddy-long-legs' myth.

719

00:42:52,840 --> 00:42:54,840

Congratulations.

720

00:42:56,840 --> 00:42:58,840

I got bitten.

721

00:42:58,840 --> 00:43:00,840

You deserve it.

722

00:43:03,840 --> 00:43:08,840

When former Teamsters boss Jimmy Hoffa disappeared in 1975,

723

00:43:08,840 --> 00:43:10,840

everyone blamed the mob.

724

00:43:10,840 --> 00:43:13,840

But no one was ever convicted of the killing,

725

00:43:13,840 --> 00:43:16,840

and nor has his body been found.

726

00:43:16,840 --> 00:43:19,840

The mystery has intrigued the country ever since.

727

00:43:19,840 --> 00:43:23,840

In one legend, his remains were disintegrated in a rendering plant.

728

00:43:23,840 --> 00:43:27,840

In others, his body was encased in concrete

729

00:43:27,840 --> 00:43:30,840

and put in a strip club in Los Angeles.

730

00:43:30,840 --> 00:43:33,840

In other stories, he's in Florida swamps.

731

00:43:33,840 --> 00:43:35,840

He's at the bottom of numerous lakes,

732

00:43:35,840 --> 00:43:38,840

particularly around Michigan, where he disappeared.

733

00:43:38,840 --> 00:43:42,840

And he is also said to be somewhere here,

734

00:43:42,840 --> 00:43:44,840

at Giant Stadium in New Jersey.

735

00:43:44,840 --> 00:43:47,840

Does the myth do anything add mystique to the team?

736

00:43:47,840 --> 00:43:49,840

Well, I think the players talk about it.

737

00:43:49,840 --> 00:43:52,840

The young players probably don't even know if the older players haven't talked about it.

738

00:43:52,840 --> 00:43:56,840

But if you're here and you work here and you coach a player,

739

00:43:56,840 --> 00:43:59,840

you know this is a spot that everybody says there's no...

740

00:43:59,840 --> 00:44:03,840

The mythbusters have honed their body-finding skills,

741

00:44:03,840 --> 00:44:07,840

practicing with ground-penetrating radar on buried pigs,

742

00:44:07,840 --> 00:44:10,840

and are ready to shake this myth up.

743

00:44:10,840 --> 00:44:12,840

So what happens if we actually find it?

744

I tell you what, you'll remove all the myth.

745

It's fact, but you can have a hard time, I think.

We need to hit the 50-yard line, the end zones,

and then there's the bump on the 10-yard line, I believe.

The 10-yard bump?

753

00:44:40,840 --> 00:44:41,840

Yeah.

754

00:44:46,840 --> 00:44:48,840

Everybody, go!

755

00:44:48,840 --> 00:44:50,840

First, the 50-yard line.

756

00:44:50,840 --> 00:44:54,840

As Jamie drags the radar across the hallowed turf,

757

00:44:54,840 --> 00:44:59,840

Dick can see exactly what's happening in the mysterious soil beneath.

758

00:45:00,840 --> 00:45:01,840

Target.

759

00:45:01,840 --> 00:45:03,840

That's where it should have been.

760

00:45:03,840 --> 00:45:05,840

It's all uniform.

761

00:45:05,840 --> 00:45:09,840

There's nothing buried here, but the system is working perfectly.

762

00:45:09,840 --> 00:45:12,840

So we would definitely be able to see like big,

763

00:45:12,840 --> 00:45:15,840

Jimmy Hoffa-shaped void in the structure of the concrete.

764

00:45:15,840 --> 00:45:17,840

Absolutely. That's correct.

765

00:45:17,840 --> 00:45:18,840

And we didn't see it?

766

00:45:18,840 --> 00:45:19,840

No, not yet.

767

00:45:19,840 --> 00:45:22,840

But they have just begun to search.

768

00:45:22,840 --> 00:45:25,840

The next target, section 107.

769

00:45:30,840 --> 00:45:32,840

How's it looking?

770

00:45:32,840 --> 00:45:34,840

It's all pretty uniform across here.

771

Go ahead on row six.

772

Go ahead.

773

00:45:37,840 --> 00:45:42,840

The mythbusters are doing a comprehensive sweep of all 41 rows.

774

If Hoffa is hogging a high-price seat, they'll soon know about it.

775

00:45:47,840 --> 00:45:48,840

The data was excellent.

776

00:45:48,840 --> 00:45:52,840

There was no anomalous features that I would interpret as being a body.

777

00:45:52,840 --> 00:45:55,840

So nothing looked at all like our pigs in concrete?

778

00:45:55,840 --> 00:45:56,840

It did not.

779

00:45:56,840 --> 00:45:57,840

There was no features like the pigs.

780

00:45:58,840 --> 00:45:59,840

All right. Well, what's next?

781

00:45:59,840 --> 00:46:00,840

Let's go on to the next site.

782

00:46:00,840 --> 00:46:01,840

All right.

783

00:46:01,840 --> 00:46:02,840

All right. Over here.

784

00:46:04,840 --> 00:46:05,840

Start your run.

785

00:46:05,840 --> 00:46:06,840

Go.

786

00:46:06,840 --> 00:46:09,840

Maybe the mythbusters will score in the end zone.

787

00:46:09,840 --> 00:46:10,840

All right.

788

00:46:10,840 --> 00:46:11,840

End of number two.

789

We're in the perfect position.

790

But what if they do?

791

It's not a prospect to be taken lightly.

792

We're not disrespecting Jimmy here.

793

We're not making any statements about his politics whatsoever.

795

All we're interested in is taking some science to the myth.

796

00:46:27,840 --> 00:46:29,840

Whether or not he's here.

797

00:46:29,840 --> 00:46:32,840

Don't even want to know who put him here.

798

00:46:33,840 --> 00:46:35,840

I really don't want to know who put him here.

799

00:46:37,840 --> 00:46:40,840

If someone told me who put him here, I'd forget about it.

800

00:46:43,840 --> 00:46:45,840

Adam can breathe a little easier for now.

801

00:46:45,840 --> 00:46:46,840

Nothing.

802

00:46:46,840 --> 00:46:47,840

Nothing.

803

00:46:47,840 --> 00:46:52,840

Jimmy is not in the end zone.

804

00:46:52,840 --> 00:46:55,840

They have just one last target.

805

00:46:56,840 --> 00:47:01,840

I'm putting the flag roughly where the bump, the bump is supposed to be.

806

00:47:01,840 --> 00:47:07,840

Coach told us that in his opinion, there is no other place that Jimmy Hoffa is supposed to be buried.

807

00:47:07,840 --> 00:47:13,840

But right here on the 10 yard line, three feet this side of the 10, what they call the bump.

808

00:47:13,840 --> 00:47:15,840

Go ahead, Jamie.

809

00:47:15,840 --> 00:47:16,840

Go.

This is the most anticipated pass of the whole adventure.

811

You going to pull it?

812

00:47:22,840 --> 00:47:23,840

I am.

Did you get anything there?

814

Right here is where he went by the bump.

815

Yeah.

816

As you can see, it's pretty uniform all the way down through.

817

Same as other stuff.

818

00:47:39,840 --> 00:47:40,840

Right.

819

00:47:40,840 --> 00:47:41,840

No bodies.

820

00:47:41,840 --> 00:47:48,840

There's nothing but testosterone, sweat and desperation at the 10 yard line.

821

00:47:48,840 --> 00:47:53,840

The Mythbusters have come up empty, but the Hoffa legend will live on.

822

00:47:53,840 --> 00:48:00,840

I think if Mythbusters doesn't find anything at Meadowlands Stadium, it actually won't impact the legend or the belief at all.

823

Don't you say that I'm a communist?

824

He's so tied up in the fabric of what it means to be American that I imagine his legend will last for a very long time.

825

The mystery of Hoffa's final resting place remains just that, but at least the Mythbusters have shown for sure where he isn't.

00:48:33,840 --> 00:48:35,840

And the famous and notorious 10 yard bump.

836

Busted.

837

00:48:36,840 --> 00:48:42,840

Jimmy Hoffa may be somewhere, but it sure as heck ain't here at Giant Stadium.

838

I'd say we can go home calling this myth Busted to Kingdom Come.

839

Okay.

840

Are you satisfied?

841

I'm satisfied.

What do you want?
