not been responding with sufficient aggression

important one of the things that the bill requires

secretary of defense the director of national

140

establish a core group that will include at a

141

appropriate security clearances from the cia

142

the nsa the department of energy the nro national
reconnaissance office the air force space force

143

the defense intelligence agency the national
geospatial intelligence agency it also basically

144

requires them as they've previously been required
and so far as i'm told haven't done fully to

145

reiterates that the dni must produce an annual

146

report on uap that is to be submitted to congress
in both an unclassified and a classified form

johnson points out by requiring that each head of

this is this is the big one any government or government contractor activity or program related
