one would expect the various committees and

about a sighting in Russia where the Russians have

two Newsweek magazine a reputable news magazine

that a quote UFO a ball of some kind was seen
hovering in the sky over the city of rostov and

173

that it was brought down by Russian fire uh so
you know no explanation no no explanation given

I mean obviously I think it's seen in the context
of the Ukraine events and maybe it'll turn out to

175

just be a drone but it was fascinating that it
was being reported in the Russian press as a UFO

and that a magazine is reputable as Newsweek
picked up on the UFO acronym and ran with it
