147

How long did you, on the bar?

149

Had a couple years.

150

00:05:47,100 --> 00:05:48,940

Do you know, like, any of the history

151

00:05:48,940 --> 00:05:50,340

of the building or anything?

152

00:05:50,340 --> 00:05:52,340

I was not familiar with the history.

153

Not familiar?

154

So I'm on a local page and they have stories

155

and there might have been a dark spirit here

156

157

making sure that whoever had the place had a hard time,

158

00:06:05,700 --> 00:06:07,220

business-wise.

159

And I could definitely see that.

160

Because there was certain times where we almost

161

had to close down because business was really bad.

162

We had a problem with wine glasses.

163

What was your problem?

164

00:06:19,140 --> 00:06:20,540

We never had any.

165

00:06:20,540 --> 00:06:25,140

We only had, like, two, maybe three wine glasses around.

166

00:06:25,140 --> 00:06:27,940

I had to constantly go out and buy wine glasses

167

00:06:27,940 --> 00:06:30,540

and I just thought the people were taking them.

168

Since I've handed the case over to Heather and Katrina,

169

00:06:33,540 --> 00:06:36,140

I'm anxious to see how they handle a psychic.

170

00:06:36,140 --> 00:06:37,740

Dealing with psychics can be challenging

171

00:06:37,740 --> 00:06:40,540

even for the most seasoned paranormal investigator.

172

00:06:40,540 --> 00:06:42,300

But when properly handled, psychics

173

00:06:42,300 --> 00:06:43,940

have given clues that have led to solving

174

00:06:43,940 --> 00:06:46,140

many major paranormal cases.

175

00:06:46,140 --> 00:06:47,940

He wants to... and that's a male energy.

176

00:06:47,940 --> 00:06:50,940

He wants people to know that he's hanging out.

177

00:06:50,940 --> 00:06:52,940

He's actually overseeing the place.

178

00:06:52,940 --> 00:06:53,940

Okay.

179

00:06:53,940 --> 00:06:54,940

Okay.

180

00:06:54,940 --> 00:06:55,940

His name was Charlie.

181

00:06:55,940 --> 00:06:57,940

So this is what I'm being sure of.

182

I think we believe the name of Charlie around.

183

It sits on here at night.

184

Are you picking up on any years

189

that he might have been in our physical world?

190

Okay.

191

He's given me between 1930 and 1940.

192

Okay.

193

00:07:23,140 --> 00:07:24,140

This show me with glasses,

194

00:07:24,140 --> 00:07:26,140

so I don't know what that means,

195

00:07:26,140 --> 00:07:28,140

but he's messing with glasses.

196

Like, if you put six glasses in a row

197

00:07:31,140 --> 00:07:33,140

and you came back the next morning,

198

00:07:33,140 --> 00:07:34,140

they wouldn't be in that row.

199

He'd be messing with them.

200

Okay.

He likes beer.

Kind of like maybe that's why he moves the wine glasses.

We should have a chat about the day's progress.

I feel like pages of notes.

210

211

with how you handled the psychic.

The one thing I didn't see you guys having

213

is the tape recorder to record.

214

Oh, man.

We totally forgot.

Brian's interview, I think.

219

There were a lot of things missing.

220

He certainly has that info.

221

I think one of the things...

222

You missed like that.

223

00:08:17,540 --> 00:08:18,540

Brian's been through a divorce.

224

00:08:18,540 --> 00:08:19,540

Right.

225

00:08:19,540 --> 00:08:20,540

Which was very traumatic.

226

00:08:20,540 --> 00:08:21,540

Did he start going to the paranormal

227

00:08:21,540 --> 00:08:22,540

right after that?

228

00:08:22,540 --> 00:08:23,540

How much time passed by?

229

00:08:23,540 --> 00:08:25,540

I am monitoring your guys, to be honest.

230

00:08:25,540 --> 00:08:26,540

We're also...

231

00:08:26,540 --> 00:08:28,540

We're trying to give you girls your space.

232

00:08:28,540 --> 00:08:29,540

But we're doing this too

233

00:08:29,540 --> 00:08:31,540

because we also want to see what you need to work on.

234

That's the only way we can figure out how to do it.

235

This is Katrina's log.

236

00:08:38,740 --> 00:08:40,740

And Heather and I just finished

237

00:08:40,740 --> 00:08:43,740

doing the first day of investigating and interviewing.

238

00:08:43,740 --> 00:08:46,740

We're not sure if we're dealing with a bar that's cursed

239

00:08:46,740 --> 00:08:48,740

or a spirit who doesn't want to leave.

240

00:08:48,740 --> 00:08:50,740

But the one common thread that holds all stories together

241

00:08:50,740 --> 00:08:52,740

is the wine glasses.

242

00:08:52,740 --> 00:08:55,740

So we've designed an experiment to test for movement.

243

00:08:55,740 --> 00:08:57,740

We're setting up wine glasses on top of baby powder.

244

00:09:01,740 --> 00:09:03,740

Oh!

245

00:09:03,740 --> 00:09:05,740

Ha!

246

00:09:05,740 --> 00:09:07,740

Ha!

247

00:09:07,740 --> 00:09:09,740

Ha!

248

00:09:09,740 --> 00:09:11,740

Like Charlie decides to move them.

249

00:09:11,740 --> 00:09:12,740

Yeah.

250

00:09:12,740 --> 00:09:14,740

Like we can tell if they move because, you know...

251

00:09:14,740 --> 00:09:15,740

Because of the baby powder?

252

00:09:15,740 --> 00:09:16,740

Right.

253

00:09:16,740 --> 00:09:17,740

Right.

254

00:09:17,740 --> 00:09:18,740

It's not moving, we're not.

255

00:09:18,740 --> 00:09:19,740

We have to do it differently.

256

00:09:19,740 --> 00:09:20,740

I know.

257

Hug.

258

Okay.

259

00:09:22,740 --> 00:09:24,740

You do realize that you started.

260

What?

It's not all that warm, my friends.

262

Good night.

263

Good night.

264

00:10:00,740 --> 00:10:02,740

Katrina's log.

265

00:10:02,740 --> 00:10:04,740

Overnight we left out two wine glasses

266

00:10:04,740 --> 00:10:06,740

on a table covered with baby powder.

267

00:10:06,740 --> 00:10:08,740

When we woke up this morning, streaks in the baby powder

268

00:10:08,740 --> 00:10:11,740

indicated that one of the glasses had moved.

269

00:10:11,740 --> 00:10:13,740

You have two wine glasses on a table.

270

00:10:13,740 --> 00:10:14,740

Mm-hmm.

271

00:10:14,740 --> 00:10:16,740

If someone bumped into a table,

272

00:10:16,740 --> 00:10:19,740

shouldn't this one have moved just as much as well?

273

00:10:19,740 --> 00:10:20,740

Right, that's what we thought.

274

00:10:20,740 --> 00:10:21,740

Yeah.

275

00:10:21,740 --> 00:10:23,740

You guys want to start experiencing bumping the table?

276

00:10:23,740 --> 00:10:24,740

Yeah.

277

00:10:24,740 --> 00:10:26,740

All right.

278

00:10:26,740 --> 00:10:29,740

Now you want to be natural, so just walk and bump up to it.

279

00:10:31,740 --> 00:10:33,740

I guess that wasn't hard enough.

280

00:10:33,740 --> 00:10:34,740

Hmm.

281

See, that one looked like it slid.

282

It's almost like it moved, it went one way,

283

That's pretty much what had to happen.

285

286

287

It had to have lifted up,

288

went down with a force to make this happen.

289

Katrina's log.

290

00:10:52,740 --> 00:10:55,740

Heather has contacted the local historical society,

291

00:10:55,740 --> 00:10:57,740

so we're going to see if we can learn more about the history

292

00:10:57,740 --> 00:10:59,740

of the building that is now Katie's Bar.

293

00:10:59,740 --> 00:11:01,740

We were trying to figure out the buildings

294

00:11:01,740 --> 00:11:04,740

that had been on the site way back into the town's past.

295

00:11:04,740 --> 00:11:08,740

This is from around 1906, and this is when it was a hotel.

296

00:11:08,740 --> 00:11:09,740

Yeah, because in the 70s,

297

00:11:09,740 --> 00:11:11,740

it's probably when it first became a bar, don't you think?

298

00:11:11,740 --> 00:11:12,740

Right.

299

00:11:12,740 --> 00:11:13,740

It changed hands a few times,

300

00:11:13,740 --> 00:11:16,740

but it's always stayed pretty much the same.

301

00:11:16,740 --> 00:11:19,740

Well, we kind of got an interesting lead, if you will,

302

00:11:19,740 --> 00:11:21,740

on a man named Charlie from the 1930s and 40s.

303

00:11:21,740 --> 00:11:23,740

One of the stories that we have heard

304

00:11:23,740 --> 00:11:25,740

about an untimely death,

305

00:11:25,740 --> 00:11:27,740

it involves a man by the name of Charlie Klein.

306

00:11:27,740 --> 00:11:29,740

Mr. Klein was managing the hotel,

307

00:11:29,740 --> 00:11:33,740

and he ran afoul of the internal revenue department

308

00:11:33,740 --> 00:11:35,740

because of selling liquor.

309

00:11:35,740 --> 00:11:36,740

Right.

310

00:11:36,740 --> 00:11:37,740

You weren't allowed to do that during prohibition.

311

00:11:37,740 --> 00:11:38,740

Right.

312

00:11:38,740 --> 00:11:39,740

The revenue came in,

313

00:11:39,740 --> 00:11:42,740

complained about he could really use a drink,

314

00:11:42,740 --> 00:11:44,740

sell it and took the booze out,

315

00:11:44,740 --> 00:11:46,740

and that's when they nailed it.

316

00:11:46,740 --> 00:11:47,740

The same spot.

317

00:11:47,740 --> 00:11:48,740

Yeah, and then the badge came out.

318

00:11:48,740 --> 00:11:49,740

So it was just set up.

319

00:11:49,740 --> 00:11:50,740

Yeah.

320

00:11:50,740 --> 00:11:51,740

He was looking into jail,

321

00:11:51,740 --> 00:11:54,740
